6.1.2 Report to be presented by the Planner, BBP-2024-68

Tim William, Manager of Planning, presented the report adding that the lands are municipally known as 24546 Adelaide Road, Strathroy and are approximately 1.05 ac in size with approximately 69.8 metres of frontage along Adelaide Road. The lands are currently vacant of buildings and not used. The property is located on the east side of Adelaide Road south end of Strathroy. The property is at the southern boundary of Strathroy. The purpose of the subject official plan and zoning by-law applications are to facilitate the development of two 3.5-storey stacked townhouse buildings containing a total of 32 stacked townhouse dwelling unit development on a private driveway and parking lot. The proposal includes 49 parking spaces of which five will be visitor parking spaces. The proposal includes an access from Adelaide Road to a parking area. Common amenity space is proposed between the buildings. This development is intended to be rental units. The applicants have advised that the development will be marketed to all.

- 6.1.5 Comments and questions from Members of Council

Councillor Hipple asks if we were to go ahead and switch this from commercial to residential and they still don't have a good idea of how they're going to have an outlet for the stormwater and what they're suggesting doesn't work out well, is this something that would put a stall to the change tonight. Tim Williams, Manager of Planning, added that tonight is the Public Meeting so a decision does not have to be made. Also added that there is some work to

be done with the applicant between now and then to narrow that so that the gap isn't so large that nothing could happen.

Councillor Willsie noted that on a lot of the other gateway projects, have heard a lot of developers talk about mixed use and being able to have a commercial and residential in the same building and was wondering if this is something that would be considered here. Mike Davis, Agent, added that the property right now is zoned C1 commercial, which is the same zone applied to the downtown core area. The segment of the 4 properties here is very much an anomaly in terms of the C1 zone is intended to apply to lands in the downtown core, which is meant to be the focus for urban compact mixed use in commercial development of that nature. Being in this location, there have been a number of background feasibility studies and there are some challenges in terms of the site suitability currently to attract the right type of tenants for a mixed use scenario. Mike added that this was an option that was strongly considered, but where they see the path forward to creating a viable project is around this more compact attainable form of housing which would be rental housing.

Councillor Kennes is very much in favour of projects like this and thinks this is something the community needs.

Councillor Pammer echoed Councillor Kennes comments and also wanted to remind everyone that there is a lot of other stuff happening in this corner including the other proposal for the highrises, so this looks like a good fit. The Councillor also inquired about sidewalks and wanted to confirm that the sidewalk would go to the property and would link up to the sidewalk at Twin Elms to give people a safe path for walking. Councillor Pammer would like more detail on landscaping or what it might look like being an entry site to the community. Tim Williams, Manager of Planning, noted that what they can ask of the developer is to construct the sidewalk in front of their property, but to have them construct a sidewalk from their property to other properties, that would be an ask not a tell. On the property design now, it does show the sidewalk extending to their driveway and leading to different buildings.

Deputy Mayor McGuire added that we have seen these types of

asks come before Council before where we've worked through projects and nothing transpires, so question is on this, where an ask is coming to us for zoning by-law amendment, is there a proposal to truly have something built on this property or is more of a phishing expedition to see if we're moving. The Deputy Mayor would also like to know when we do these types of changes, can they be time restrictive. Mike Davis added that the intention here is to build. In regards to the second part, the province is in process of rolling out some new tools that are tied to that, not necessarily come into play at the zoning by-law amendment stage, more so at the site plan approval which ties to servicing allocations and capacities and there are tools coming that will support municipalities.

Councillor Derbyshire has concerns about the location of this as there are no parks nearby and there is a major highway close by, a sidewalk that stops nowhere and you essentially have a senior living behind.

12. Enquiries or Comments by Members

Deputy Mayor McGuire has received questions in regards to no parking signs that were put up on Riverview Drive and would like an explanation as to how the process occurred and why those parking signs were put on Riverview Drive north of Hull Road. CAO McKibbin added that there was a complaint received, so staff went out and did an assessment of the area and determined that no parking signs should be placed on one side of the road to ensure path of travel for safety of pedestrians walking along the road because there was no sidewalks.

Councillor Derbyshire expressed concerns about a personal matter with the Fire Chief and was advised that concerns should be directed to CAO McKibbin or Human Resources.

Councillor Willsie thanked people in area for putting on Canada Day celebrations including volunteers as well as municipal staff for helping organize. The Councillor has also been speaking to the Mount Brydges Lions who were discussing their meeting nights and pickleball that is scheduled at the same time as their meetings on Monday night and was wondering if staff could free up Monday nights so pickleball isn't scheduled at the same time as the Lions meeting as they are not able to conduct regular business with the noise of the pickelball in the next room at Caradoc Community Centre. Director Lilbourne

asked for more information from the Lions Club as staff may be able to adjust the time of pickleball.

Councillor Kennes has received an inquiry from someone who asked why there was no fireworks in Strathroy this year on Canada Day and responded that there used to be, however there was no group willing to take the lead on holding fireworks within the community at this time, so encouraged them to find or form a group that would and the municipality always has seed money available for such projects in the future. Councillor Kennes also wanted to remind everyone that our by-law for fireworks allows fireworks on Canada Day and Victoria Day Holiday, however hears them throughout the weekend, so thinks people need to be reminded that it's supposed to be on the holiday day only.

Councillor Hipple also wanted to thank everyone who participated for the Del-Ko Brydge Canada Day celebrations. It took place in Komoka this year and is always very well attended and the food is always delicious. The Councillor wanted to inquire about seniors cards and with summer camps, the seniors get knocked out of the areas that they are in and ultimately they are taking a break throughout the summer. Asked about the Caradoc Community Centre and if there is a smaller room there that can be used for seniors. Councillor Hipple also asked about the market and when it has to be cancelled and can't be moved indoors, has anyone ever thought about using the Caradoc Community Centre. Director Lilbourne added that seniors cards at Caradoc Community Centre can be looked into. In regards to the market, the goal is to cancel the market as few times as possible and the past weekend, an email was sent out the Friday morning to all vendors with a survey to see who would be willing to relocate to the Gemini and only 8 said yes. The Director added that he will pass that along to those who run the market to consider the Caradoc Community Centre as an option.
