Deputy Mayor McGuire spoke to the Middlesex County Council Highlights - August 13, 2024.

11. Enquiries or Comments by Members

Councillor Hipple spoke to the traffic on Head Street as school is starting tomorrow and biggest concern last year was traffic. Added that there is an incredible amount of students and teachers and staff starting tomorrow and asking all people who are driving to slow down and be thoughtful in your driving habits/patterns and be aware and wishes everyone the best for their first day.

Councillor Kennes added that bridge on Caradoc Street is closed for a month, and Front Street is being cut up and down Arthur Street, the drain is going in, Strathroy Crossing, and there are also new traffic lights also going up at Head and Metcalfe. As part of kids going back to school and driving in these conditions, people need to exercise their control and caution and take extra time.

Councillor Willsie wanted to look at insurance costs and remembers being told that insurance for the municipality would be going up by close to 30% and was wondering if this is a tendered item and if it is not, if it could be tendered with those amounts coming back to Council. Also inquired about user fees and thinks we need to take a look at what user fees are and adjust them so that the Community Services department can be more self sustaining and that our taxpayers can be supporting our own resources and own construction projects rather than people who drive in from out of town and is hoping to do that at an upcoming Strategic Priorities meeting.

Councillor Brennan echoed the comments about traffic and hoping to have a budget by second meeting in January.

Councillor Pelkman spoke to the traffic and back to school and reminded everyone to pay attention to school buses.

Councillor Derbyshire wanted to make sure we stay on top of some of the things needed in Mount Brydges and wanted to make sure major infrastructure projects are on the radar.

Councillor Pammer wanted to mention that the homeless prevention program has been funded again until March 31, 2025 and this is the program that works with the community navigator and Middlesex social services, CMHA, and Thames Valley Addiction to provide shelter and community support services to individuals

when they're homeless or at risk of being homeless.

Mayor Grantham attended the AMO Conference in August with Councillor Kennes and CAO McKibbin. The Mayor added that it was a great event, there were a lot of good interactions with ministers and had two delegations on behalf of the municipality, one with MTO to maintain funding for transit and the other with the Minister of Health and was able to brag about the two very large donations that came from the public. Mayor Grantham was also able to bring forward the fact that the municipality has done their bit by donating land.
