Why was Warrior Health created?

- In 2022, the Province of Ontario launched the Mental Health Supports for Public Safety Personnel (MHS4PSP) initiative.
- Following a rigorous selection process, Wounded Warriors Canada was selected as the successful vendor to design and deliver the services and programs for the "Warrior Health" components of Ontario's MHS4PSP program.
- The Warrior Health consortium was created and launched to deliver the objectives established by SOLGEN.

Why a consortium-powered solution?

- Brings together more than 300 years of combined mental health experience.
- Brings together more than 1,000 mental health counsellors, treatment providers, navigators and volunteers.
- The 5 consortium partners are at the forefront of Public Safety mental health research and innovation.
- Deeply experienced in providing trauma-informed and culturally competent care to Public Safety Professionals and their families.

- National mental health service provider, dedicated to serving Trauma-Exposed professionals and their families.

What is different about the Warrior Health model?

- Makes a comprehensive suite of evidence-based, validated and trauma-informed mental health and resilience services available, in support of Ontario's public safety personnel (PSP) and their families.
 - These are not "new" or untested service offerings.
 - These are existing, sought-after services that are in use within the PSP / PSO communities, now available under one consolidated offering.
 - Assists PSOs in accessing these services by leveraging the Provincial RFP.
- Assists in addressing current gaps in the access and delivery of <u>proactive / upstream</u> mental health supports for PSP.
- Delivers programs that are trauma-informed, based in an understanding of the unique trauma experienced by PSP.
- All aspects of the *Warrior Health* experience and service offerings are <u>culturally competent</u> and based in an understanding of the unique needs and experiences of PSP.
- Prioritizes the needs of Indigenous, racialized and minoritized PSP, by design.



Warrior Health – Who is this for?

The more than 80,000 trauma-exposed public safety personnel (both uniform and civilian) in Ontario, including:

- Police Officers
- Paramedics
- Firefighters and Fire Investigators
- Wildland Firefighters and support workers
- Emergency Services Call-takers / Dispatchers / Communicators
- Correctional Employees / Probation Officers / Parole Officers
- Coroners / Forensic Pathologists / Forensic Scientists
- Provincial Emergency Operations Centre (PEOC) staff and Field Officers
- Conservation Officers and Animal Welfare Inspectors
- PSP families
- PSP retirees



Warrior Health – Who is this for?



Warrior Health = Two distinct paths:

A core services platform for all Public Safety Personnel (including retirees) and their families.

A basket of services available to Public Safety Organizations.



Warrior Health – For Public Safety Personnel

The Core Services Platform is a secure digital "Front Door" (web portal and mobile app – providing PSP and their families (including retirees) with a suite of services that include:

- Internet-based cognitive behavioural therapy (iCBT) services
 - Powered by the SENTIO By Homewood Health platform
- Self-assessment tools
- Educational resources
- A 24/7 PSP Service Hub phone line (for navigational assistance)
 - A 24/7 peer support phone line provided by Boots on the Ground
 - Confidential / Live answer / Staffed by trained PSP colleagues
- Full access to the PSPNET Families portal and programming
- Additional services are being explored to further enhance the portal

NOTES:

- The Warrior Health core services platform is 100% anonymous, confidential and free for all PSP and their families.
- The portal will feature full multi-language support and will be fully AODA compliant.
- The portal is flexible, adaptable and expandable.



- The core services platform is being developed by and will be operated by Homewood Health.
- Designed with anonymity at its core.
- Data will never be sold / provided to third parties.
- Fully confidential and anonymous no data sharing with Public Safety Organizations (PSO).
- Data will only be accessible on a need-to-know basis within the Warrior Health consortium, and solely to enable the provision and evaluation of the requested services.
- All data is encrypted both in transport and while being stored.
- All backups for disaster recovery remain within Canada.



Warrior Health – For Public Safety Organizations

What will be available?

The basket of available services will include a range of fee-for-service options including:

- General Wellness and Resiliency training programs
- Peer Support Training and Services
- Leadership training
- Pre-employment mental health screening and recruitment tools
- Mindfulness programming
- Supports to reduce mental health stigma


How will these services be accessed?

Warrior Health – Who Pays For This?

Core Services Platform for PSPs

• Entirely free and available to all PSP (and their families) across Ontario – funded by the Province of Ontario.

Basket of Service Offerings for PSOs

Municipal and First Nations Colleagues

- In Spring 2025, the Province of Ontario will open and administer an application process to receive grant funding –
 enabling Municipal and First Nations PSOs to apply for funding to support the implementation of services they wish to
 take advantage of.
 - This represents the first-of-its-kind investment in proactive and preventative mental health and resilience funding for public safety personnel in Ontario.
- Municipal and First Nations PSO's, who are approved for grant funding, will be required to participate in Warrior Health program evaluation.
 - Additional details to come via SOLGEN leadership.

Provincial Colleagues

SOLGEN will provide additional details on how these services are able to be accessed.



Warrior Health – When can I access this?

- For Municipal and First Nations PSOs:
 - In Spring 2025, the Province of Ontario will open and administer an application process to receive grant funding enabling Public Safety Organizations to procure funding supports for the additional benefit programs they wish to take advantage of.
- Spring 2025 The Warrior Health *Core Services Platform* will go live and be available to all PSPs (and their families) in Ontario, free of charge.
- Spring 2025 The basket of services will become available to PSOs across Ontario, via Warrior Health.



Warrior Health – What's Next?

- The first program deliverable has been completed on time, on budget and within scope.
 - The "Deliverable One Report" has been submitted and exceptional collaboration continues.
- Development and testing of the Core Services Portal is ongoing and on-track.
- The detailed "Basket of Services Menu" has been finalized.
 - The detailed *basket of services menu* will be made available to all PSOs in Ontario, in support of the upcoming launch of Ontario's Grant / Transfer Payment application process.
- Work is ongoing on the implementation process for the *Basket of Services* that will be available to all Ontario PSOs via Warrior Health.
