SUBJECT:	Speed Limit Request Policy

RECOMMENDATION: THAT: Report EPW-2025-13 "Speed Limit Request Policy" be received for information, and further;

THAT: Council endorse the Speed Limit Request Policy, and further;

THAT: By-law No. 29-25 be referred to the Consideration of By-laws section of the agenda for consideration and adoption.

BACKGROUND:

In response to ongoing concerns from residents about traffic speeds and road safety, the Traffic Committee recommended the establishment of a Speed Limit Request Policy. The goal is to create a standardized, transparent, and data-supported process for evaluating speed limit changes on Municipal owned roads.

COMMENTS:

Speed limit change requests are common inquires that staff and Council receive. The proposed policy outlines a five-step process for handling these requests as described in the attached Speed Limit Request Policy:

- 1. Review Initiation
 - Residents or Council member submit a Speed Limit Request Form to the Municipality
- 2. Initial Screening
 - Staff conduct an evaluation to determine if the request meets minimum criteria for further study
- 3. Speed Limit Change
 - Staff analyze traffic data and roadway characteristics to determine an appropriate speed limit recommendation
- 4. Approval

- o Recommended speed limit change is presented to Council for review and approval
- 5. Implementation
 - Upon approval, new speed limit signs are installed in accordance with Ontario Traffic Manual Book 5 guidelines

Data Collection & Evaluation

The Municipality currently operates 12 solar-powered speed radar signs that continuously collect traffic volume and speed data. These devices will be used to support evidence-based decision making when evaluating speed limit requests.

Staff are recommending that Council endorse the Speed Limit Request Policy to establish a consistent, data-driven, and transparent procedure for evaluating and implementing changes to speed limits on municipal owned roadways.
