Criminal Investigation Division investigated the following incidents of note:

- February 2nd – SC26000780 – Distribution of Intimate Images – CID looking to establish with the victim whether an offence has been committed in order to decide whether DFU will download the phone.
- February 10th - SC26001020 and SC25001021 – Sexual Assault – CID received information about a historical sexual assault complainant that was reported to the London Police Service. The information provided was from an anonymous complainant that provided intricate details about the offences. The information also spoke to a separate investigation being conducted by the OPP outside the SCPS jurisdiction. SCPS then received information from the Windsor Police Service who interviewed the victim on behalf of the SCPS in relation to these same details that occurred in the Municipality of Strathroy-Caradoc. Investigation ongoing.
- February 23rd – SC26001445 (master) - Swatting – Local schools continue to be the target of swatting from threat actors. CID is working the Department of Homeland Security, the London Police Service and various other agencies at home and abroad in an attempt to identify a suspect or suspects in these investigations.
- Street Crime Unit (SCU) – During the month of February 2026, SCU generated 13 reportable occurrences. SCU currently has 3 active investigations.
- The Digital Forensics Unit, in February, completed four downloads of four devices for four different investigations.
