Dear Mayor Vanderheyden;

I write this letter to you today to express an urgent concern that I and my fellow Tri-Township Arena Board members discussed at our May 13th, 2021 board meeting.

As you know, the Tri-Township arena in Mt. Brydges has been operated under a partnership agreement since its inception in 1974. The agreement was conceived in the beginning to pool the resources of several small communities who would otherwise not be large enough to afford to build nor operate an arena facility in their own community. While the agreement served its intended financial goals, it also brought these communities and cultures together and connected us in unique and unexpected ways. Families were brought together and formed lifelong bonds through the activities that were held in the arena. Eventually, these communities began to think of themselves as one connected community.

Since 1974, the arena has seen many of its original partners leave the agreement. To this day, only one community remains partnered with Strathroy-Caradoc in the Tri-Township Arena, the Chippewa of the Thames First Nation. Our bond with the Chippewa community has been strong since 1974 and our communities enjoy a mutually beneficial partnership where our families can gather together to enjoy recreational activities in a safe environment. Our relationship with the Chippewa community has been very good throughout our history in this agreement.

Recently, Strathroy-Caradoc released a study that was commissioned by the municipality that recommended the decommissioning of the Tri-Township Arena. Our board was given only hours' notice before the study was released, and the consultants involved in creating the study failed to consult in a meaningful way with our only longstanding partner in creating the recommendations that affected the partnership agreement. The Chippewa Nation and our board learned the details of these plans through a media release. At the very least, the media release should have been held until our partners were properly consulted leader-to-leader. This lack of consultation has damaged the relationship that we currently enjoy with the Chippewa nation, and has alienated our partners in this longstanding agreement.

As this issue has escalated, I now fear lasting, if not permanent damage to our relationship, and to the people of the Chippewa of the Thames First Nation. At this point, the Chippewa Nation shares fifteen percent of the operations of the facility and has invested significantly in the facility. As a signatory of our agreement, I strongly urge you to set aside any feelings or opinions you have regarding your position on an arena in Mt. Brydges, and connect directly with Chief Jacqueline French in an attempt to mend this damage and save our relationship. I further believe that future consultation involving the fate of the Tri-Township Arena must be inclusive of the leadership of the Chippewa of the Thames First Nation as our board is unable to bind the municipality in any legal agreement.

Good Afternoon,

It is understood that council has not made any decisions on the Nustadia report recommendations but there are obviously still many concerns. I am a resident of Mount Brydges and am addressing concerns only related to Mount Brydges.

The wants from the residents of Mount Brydges are not now, nor in the future likely to mirror the wants of Strathroy. They should not be painted with the same brush. They are two separate personalities and have to be treated as such. Mount Brydges is a village and Strathroy is a town.

A survey needs to be delivered to every home in the NOL 1WO area code and not hidden on the website accessible to those with internet for a mere two weeks. A survey with applicable questions to the residents in this area code would give valuable information and data for future planning. The present survey does not reveal true data when it is delivered as a whole as you are comparing apples to oranges nor has it been delivered in a manner that is inclusive. Out of the 555 surveys completed, it only showed 119 residents of Mount Brydges. (I was not one of those 119 residents. I was not aware there was a survey out there)

With capital projects, infrastructure, recreation, community housing and other major planning decisions to be made, the residents of the town involved should be informed and have their questions and opinions valued. Residents directly affected by decisions being made and directions being taken need transparency. Residents are who you serve.

When forming the Recreation Facility Infrastructure Renewal Strategy (RFIRS) committee it would be advantageous to adopt a committee for Mount Brydges with equal council members to equal volunteer residents for decisions and discussions made directly affecting infrastructure and growth in Mount Brydges. "Shovel ready" must be a mutual triumph.

If council were to listen to what the local residents in Mount Brydges want in their community then backlash over the impractical and hurried decisions/suggestions would be minimal (Lions Park Housing Development – Lions Park Driveway Development) Both plans being recognized as deceptive, rushed and absurd.

Comments on Recommendation #1

Regarding the Tri-Township Arena, while it may be financially sound to take it down it does not mean that it doesn't need to be replaced. Mount Brydges needs at least a single pad arena. Ice time for many years has been scarce. A twin pad would give more seasonal options and help ease the ice shortage and allow for non-ice related activities. The Bulldogs (1975) are not the Rockets ~ the Cougars are not Jr Rockets ~ the Mount Brydges Skating Club (1974) is not Strathroy Skating Club and they should not be treated as such. These are proud Mount Brydges athletic ambassadors that are not in any way emotionally related to Strathroy-Caradoc. None of these groups want a covered pavilion but that's exactly the suggestions you get when the reports are from non-invested corporations and not local residents. When the Tri-Township arena needs to come down - it needs to come down AFTER it is replaced and the new arena is built and fully open for use in Mount Brydges. Anything less than this is unacceptable for the Mount Brydges residents.

Comments on Recommendation #4

Regarding the Caradoc Community Centre. With the recent growth in Mount Brydges a Community Centre is needed more than ever. The Nustadia reporting on the Community Centre is unreliable as it is based on Mount Brydges and Strathroy as a whole and is working with outdated and inaccurate population data. The census in 2016 shows Mount Brydges having approximately 1842 people. The 2021 census we are presently filling in will show a much greater number of people. Many new families have moved into the area and the necessity for community involvement grows. The need for Senior, Child, Youth Centre, Meeting rooms, larger library, computer lab, basketball, walking track this is a list of endless possibilities. Priority given to what the Mount Brydges residents want and need, again, it's not a Walmart.....Mount Brydges isn't Strathroy. The land that the Community Centre and the Tri-Township arena sits on is ideal for a Multi-Plex facility where everything is in the one area. There is already the baseball diamond, the trails, the Lions Park – great land for community hub but again Nastadia wouldn't know that. Mount Brydges residents don't want to travel to Strathroy for their recreational activities.

It's very frustrating to be a Strathroy-Caradoc tax payer in Mount Brydges and not often seeing our tax dollars benefitting Mount Brydges in projects that matter to us.

Build it here. Be transparent. Have integrity. Get true data. Talk to the residents.

I feel the need to voice my opinion on the closing of the arena in Mount Brydges. In short, I think it is a mistake.

Closing the arena without a plan to replace it in Mount Brydges will remove what has become a major feature of our community. I have lived here for 34 years and have raised two children in the area. While our family was not a hockey family, my daughter figure skated for 9 years. I spent many memorable Saturdays watching the skating club Carnival, they even roped me into helping set up and take down a few times, my wife spent countless hours making costumes and driving to the practices. Had we needed to drive to Strathroy that would not have happened. It was an opportunity to participate in the community. I hope the new residents are given the same opportunities.

I appreciate that the existing arena is a "single use" facility, but I have been to dances, parties and skating events in this facility, both figure skating and hockey games. I am sure with some imagination a new facility could be built to accommodate other activities as well, an attached wing to accommodate the pickle ball or indoor sports crowd and a walking track could easily be incorporated into the arena.

I am no expert on these things, but your consultants misjudged the demand in the community in a big way. The reason an arena was not mentioned as a requirement in the community in their survey, is because we already had one. I have spoken to many people in and around Mount Brydges and the result of my informal poll is heavily weighted in favor of an ice pad facility. While it would be nice to have some of the other features mentioned in the virtual meeting about the decommissioning of the arenas in Mount Brydges and Strathroy, there is a real demand for hockey and figure skating ice as well. A new facility should not be less than what we had to begin with. Mount Brydges has a strong history of hockey and figure skating with several teams from both sports relying on having available ice-time. Replacing two ice surfaces with a single new pad in Strathroy does not equate. It will not cover the demand.

One of the other components of the report was of the aging community members not being skaters with a need for ice time. I am one of those for sure but look around, this council has approved several new subdivisions in Mount Brydges, hundreds of homes, and several more in Strathroy. Many of these houses are filled with young families, some who chose to move here because it has the arena as a resource (I can get you names if you need them). The census numbers they quoted were from 2016 and are not reflective of our current population or needs. How many more new families are here now and how many more are coming than in 2016?

I think this plan is short sighted. I am not sure of the long-term intentions or the intended use of the existing arena space. It is early days yet (I hope) in the planning of this project. I understand the existing aging arena needs updating and more realistically replacement, but I am sure we can do better for the community than what I saw in the presentation. I would be interested in seeing the plans for what has been proposed. Maybe when the Covid virus is under control we will be better able to interact and get this done well.

It is home to the Mt Brydges Cougars and the BullDogs Junior C Hockey team. Players come from Komoka, Kilworth, Delaware, Melbourne and Mt Brydges. It is home to the Mt Brydges Skating clubs from all the same areas. Willy and I attended many dances and barbeques at the arena which were hosted by the Lion's Club and other groups. This old arena has always been loved and well utilized by the community over the past 40 years or so. With Mt. Brydges and the surrounding area growing so quickly over the last decade, I can't imagine not having an arena here. The old one should be replaced by a new arena in Mt. Brydges, the tax payers here deserve it very much. Mary Lou DeWinter.

Strathroy-Caradoc Council Members,

My name is Kathryn Minten, and my family's sports and activities hub has revolved around Strathroy for years. While I live on a farm in Adelaide-Metcalfe, I am excited that your municipal Council is looking into new facilities to support healthy and active living, and would like to provide some feedback.

As a youth I spent my winters indoors playing volleyball, basketball, and soccer, and I would like to speak towards the importance of gaining indoor gym facilities and soccer pitches, as proposed by Nustadia Recreation. I can understand that the recommendation of decommissioning older facilities is a difficult proposition for a town council, and that arenas and the sport of hockey is tied deeply to community identity; however, non-school board gyms are highly lacking in our area and have great potential for developing youth and adult sports, increasing community health and activity, and supplying general municipal revenue.

I highly support the recommendation for the gyms and turf facility at the Gemini location; however, I believe that the increased indoor space may not be enough for the community. There are so many opportunities for continued growth in sports and active living, as well as areas that are completely untapped, that there is reason to believe Strathroy-Caradoc will outgrow these facilities quickly enough. It would be unfortunate to need expansions within the next 10 years, or find financing for additional facilities. If financially possible, even the addition of a smaller gymnasium (half sized), a racquet court, or studio facility would support many additional smaller activities for the wide demographics and interests of Strathroy-Caradoc, without impeding activities in need of a full-sized gym area.

I understand that you need to consider your own municipality needs, finances, and tax base; however, I would like you to also consider that many of your surrounding rural municipalities (such as Adelaide-Metcalfe) turn to you primarily for their recreational activities for youth and adults alike. There are many rural families just outside your boundary who drive to London and Sarnia, but would gladly stay closer to home if you had facilities available.

Many of the inadequacies of Strathroy facilities that were present in my youth still exist today for my own children. For starters, playing competitive levels of soccer in my youth, London teams were quick to recruit and it was a simple decision to leave our small town due to better facilities – especially the opportunity to play and train year-round at various indoor facilities. We would use community gyms for workouts and sprint training, and rent indoor turf for practices and winter training leagues. I continued to play turf soccer throughout my teen and adult years, travelling both to the indoor dome facilities near London airport, as well as the newer BMO location by the Western Fair grounds. We were willing to take game times that would start as late as 11pm in the middle of January, just to get on the field. Crazy? Maybe... but it was all that was available. Crazier still – there were industrial leagues for the local shift workers that started after we left the pitch at midnight.

Considering the incredible growth in the sport of soccer – for which Strathroy has done a great job creating and maintaining numerous outdoor facilities – the town must realize that just as competitive hockey teams vie for summer ice time, the competitive soccer players will go where they can train during the winter... and often they will not come back. My high school coaches often became frustrated as top players were picked off by recruiters – "Strathroy would have top level teams if everyone would just stay here!" Our high school soccer team (SDCI) went to OFSAA four years

straight and brought home a silver, two bronze and a fourth – yet during those years, many of us played for London teams. I see the same thing happening today.

Tiring of travelling to London in the winter, I decided to try the YMCA women's indoor soccer league here in Strathroy; however, playing in a high school gym is tolerable as the only local option, but extremely frustrating – dealing with bleachers on all walls and having subs sitting on the bleachers rather than out of the play area is ridiculous and unsafe.

I believe there are also opportunities for the indoor domes to put down a tee-off layer (so as not to damage the turf) or putting range, so golfers can get in some winter practice during the daytime hours when soccer rentals are low. And seeing that adult baseball is also a prominent activity in Strathroy, and the youth lacrosse program being developed was very popular, these groups could also make use of indoor turf facilities and provide additional revenue.

The addition of an indoor turf facility is a fantastic idea and one that is long overdue for a soccer community like Strathroy. I highly support this initiative!

While soccer is very well known in Strathroy, there are two other winter sports I'm highly involved in that are not: basketball and volleyball. And it's a shame, because they are actually quite popular in our community, but poorly supported. The recommendation of creating new gym facilities attached to the Gemini would be an incredible opportunity for athletic development in Strathroy-Caradoc, and this is a long overdue addition to the sports community that moves outside the arena.

When I was in Grade 5, I joined the Strathroy Spirit basketball team – both learning skills and training with their house league, as well as joining their competitive travel team (Ontario Basketball Association). Did you know that this league – which was founded in Strathroy in 1992 – is still running today!? The two provincial gold medals that we brought home during the 5 years I played is only a small slice of the ignored basketball legacy of this program.

Now, 25 years later, my own daughters have joined this league, and I have volunteered over the years as a House League coach, an assistant competitive level coach, and am the current Secretary/Treasurer for the league, and help in other capacities as well. In the two years previous to COVID, the Spirit basketball program saw a dramatic increase in participation, merely due (I believe) to increased awareness of the program. The house league for girls in Grades 3-8 increased over 200% since 2017, from 16 participants to 47. There was so much demand that we had to create an entirely new program for Grade 3-6 after the house league ended (which we had to cap based on gym availability), just so they could keep playing. Also, the U14 team in 2018 was so popular that in 2019 we had to split the team into two age groups, and we had over 40 girls try out for the U14 and U15 teams. We even had more parent volunteers join the league than ever before! The U19 team from 2018 was an incredible group of girls; one was recruited early by Western University and others went on to play university and college level basketball. The only non-graduate that year ended up travelling to London and took a top spot on the London Ramblers JWL team (a top competitive female league for Ontario); she has since been recruited by Western as well.

The 2019 season also came with discussions with Strathroy-Caradoc about expanding to offer a boys' league, which the town recreation department developed and ran at a local school. When Al Campbell ran the boys' basketball development program in Strathroy, it was extremely popular – I now have two boys, 9 and 10 years old, who would like to play, and we have nothing local to offer them. As an organization, Strathroy Spirit is continually getting emails from parents looking for a boys' basketball program – there is a demand for it, and if it was actually advertised, I'm sure it would boom again! Internally, we were already discussing how we would prepare for the expected increase of House League registrations for 2020-2021 and how to juggle our gym availability. Even though we wanted to provide more opportunities, capping registrations would be our only solution.

One of the greatest challenges is that other than the West Middlesex Memorial Center (whose gym floor is in unfortunate condition considering the more recent renovations), there are no other gyms in Strathroy-Caradoc that

are not linked to the local school boards. This means we work around their sports teams' practice/game/tournament schedules, and other school community events. In the past, these events have often run late and cut into the gym time for Strathroy Spirit, or, on occasion, completely cancel our time, often without much notice. The municipality would do well to become more independent from the school board to develop athletic activities in our area.

The proposed gym facilities would also be an incredible benefit to the local volleyball community. As a youth, I had to travel to London for any kind of volleyball camps or competitive team opportunities; and in 25 years, that has barely changed. Only in 2019-2020 did the Strathroy-Caradoc begin offering a youth volleyball program; and even with a choppy program release, I believe it had a fairly decent turnout.

One of the most promising indicators of a healthy youth volleyball program in Strathroy-Caradoc, is that it would be extremely well supported by adults. All you have to look at is the current adult leagues provided by the Recreation Department. At one point, Strathroy had a YMCA adult league (which has since been absorbed by the town league, I believe), a community rec/pickup league, and a community co-ed competitive league. Since I began playing in the adult comp league about 8 years ago, it has grown from four teams into a three-tiered league of 24 teams... and there is still a waiting list. Prior to COVID, we were beginning discussions of creating a women's league – many players travel to London to play at Supreme Courts or Spikes for men's and women's leagues. (FYI: the net height for men's and women's volleyball is dramatically different, as is hitting strength – there are many positives to offering separate leagues). Throughout COVID, we have played 4-on-4 at the WMMC whenever the restrictions allowed. Although our registration fees have increased over the years, we are still slightly cheaper than London, and as the competitive level of play has significantly increased over the years with the tiering system, we are actually drawing London players to Strathroy! Imagine that! The potential to develop more adult programs is very promising; and notably, many of the adult league players are in the 25-40 age range and have kids that would follow in their parent's footsteps. The youth volleyball program is just beginning, but highly undeveloped – this has huge potential for growth with the building of new indoor gym facilities.

There is an incredible amount of opportunity to develop indoor soccer, basketball and volleyball programs in our community for various reasons:

- Cheap equipment sports compared to hockey: indoor soccer shoes, shin pads, and socks; running shoes, and knee pads.
- Lower registration costs than arena sports
- Low maintenance cost by comparison to ice pads
- Wide age range for participation both youth and adult leagues would be popular
- Current programs can't grow due to lack of gym availability "if you build it, they will come"
- Completely new opportunities ex. boys' basketball, youth volleyball teams, winter indoor soccer
- Not school board dependant for gym access
- Gymnasiums are year-round investments, not just winter alternatives

I will also repeat my request that you please continue to consider the needs of your entire surrounding community as well – Strathroy continues to grow as a central location for our area by offering facilities which are competitive to the larger nearby centers. You will continue to have our support!

Just reskimmed the report, and realized that Nustadia recommended turning one of the outdoor soccer fields behind the Gemini into a turfed field with lights. Initially, I read this as a domed indoor turf location (which I would support), but I realized the domed location is recommended for the Mount Brydges site.

I would HIGHLY stress that the Council should further review the benefits of an outdoor turf field. Indoor is necessary during the winter months; but I've never met a player who would rather be on turf.

This is a great article about why real grass is better than turf, and it's not just 'Because I like it better'

https://mastersoccermind.com/the-reason-why-all-soccer-players-prefer-grass-over-turf/

The two key benefits of an outdoor turf field is lower annual maintenance, and less issues regarding weather (can't get on the fields early enough — which I realize can be a big problem in Strathroy, especially the Cuddy fields). These are points entirely for a council, but not for the athlete. If you're thinking about the people who will actually use it and not just the maintenance costs, then this recommendation should be omitted.

I wanted to reach out to you on behalf of the Bluewater Hawks Girls Hockey Association.

First off I would like to thank everyone for the hard work in developing the draft master plans. While this is still a draft plan I wanted to raise a major concern we have. I think consolidating the ice pads to one location is a great idea for many reasons, however our concern lies with reducing the number of pads from 4 to 3. Currently we have 16 teams (5 more teams then we had 6 years ago) and our projections show we will be growing again next season. With 4 ice pads currently, Strathroy-Caradoc cannot accommodate our ice needs. I am not sure how you plan to do so with 3. In the past season we have been buying ice in over 4 different Municipalities.

The Bluewater Hawks Girls Hockey Association is a regional competitive girls hockey association. In 2020-2021 we had over 200 girls registered to play. Many of these girls travel from outside our community to play here. While here to practice and play these families are spending time in our community. They are visiting our restaurants, coffee shops, grocery stores and more. Every week we also have 150-200 visiting families coming to play in our Municipality. These families are generating a lot of income for our local businesses.

With the rate that Strathroy Caradoc is growing I am not sure why there would be a decision to reduce the amount of available ice. Between Strathroy Minor Hockey, Bluewater Hawks, Strathroy Caradoc Youth Hockey, Strathroy Figure Skating Club, Mt Brydges Minor Hockey, Mt Brydges Figure Skating Club, public skating and adult teams. (even your Strathroy Caradoc Fire and Police rent ice weekly for exercise and comradery) there is a lot of demand for ice. These organizations are giving close to 1000 kids in our community a place to exercise and have fun. Organized sports can improve a child's self-esteem, teach them about teamwork, help them develop self-discipline and social skills. Kids in sports make life-long friends and grow a strong tie to the communities they play in.

Community Services, Councillors and Mayor,

I'm writing to express deep concern over the recent release of the Municipality of Strathroy-Caradoc's Recreation Facility Infrastructure Renewal Plan, which sets out to decommission the Tri-Township Arena next year.

The information in the Council Report is stale-dated and doesn't consider the recent growth of this town, with the addition of substantial amounts of residential development, including South Creek, the ever-expanding Woods Edge, Lion's Gate, and the upcoming Garden Grove, Timberview Trail, as well as multi-unit dwellings and other big projects that are in the works. With more households and people, we need MORE access to recreational options, not LESS.

I've seen the proposals for recreational upgrades coming this year, including tennis and pickleball courts, and this is great, but the ARENA is the heart of our community. The Canada Community-Building Fund is just that, a "community building" fund; it's NOT an excuse to take away the very thing that brings our community together! Recreational infrastructure needs to reflect the wants and needs of the community, which filters through the community itself, not a round table of people looking at numbers! Community partnerships need to be considered too, like the Lions etc.

On a personal level, I took my kids skating at Moms & Tots every Thursday morning when they were preschoolers. My son went on to play with the Mt. Brydges Cougars and has a collection of OMHA medals from the many years he has played with MBDAA. My daughter grew up skating with the Magic Blades, who almost always made the podium, leaving people asking "where the heck is Mount Brydges anyway?" The truth is, we are on the map because ice runs in our veins; it's part of our community, our culture, and our hearts.

I watched my brother play as a Bulldog about 25 years ago, and his jersey still hangs in the Dog House. I was honoured to be a guest speaker at the 2019 Commemorative Night held at the Tri-Township Arena in honour of our "ice angels", an event that showcased just how dedicated our community is to the game, and the people that play it. I was also fortunate enough to be on the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) for Strathroy-Caradoc's Hometown Hockey and I think it's very safe to say that this area absolutely loves the game! Some might even call it a healthy obsession!!

As you've already seen, our small community has a very strong voice and we will fight this to protect our arena, our HUB, our wellbeing. We understand that the facility needs work, but it's well worth the investment. Your MBDAA, Jr. C, Magic Blades, Moms & tots, mens leagues, etc. will thank you! For many years to come!!

I viewed this evening's Recreation Facility Infrastructure meeting.

I appreciate that the committee recognizes the value in hearing from individual organizations and offering these organizations the opportunity to provide presentations to the Committee.

A formal Recreation Facility Infrastructure Plan public consultation process is required to allow for everyone to be heard. It is clear that the initial consultation was not sufficient, as it did not clearly present the existing problems/opportunities, or any strategies and alternatives to address them. Given the magnitude of the decisions ahead, it is critical that the process for consultation be clearly presented and outlined, along with established timelines for input or feedback.

I understand a mailout is not feasible. There are several other options for public engagement and consultation. Here are a few online options that I would encourage staff to consider for the Recreation Facility Infrastructure Plan:

- a single email address to direct all inquiries regarding the plan to staff and Council regarding this plan.

Staff will need to accommodate some alternate formats as well from residents.

I am a resident of Mount Brydges. My husband and I moved to this community in 2010. We were attracted to this small town community and the amenities, including the school and recreation amenities, such as the parks, as well as the arena (with both wonderful skating and hockey clubs). The Tri-Township Area is more than a building. It is the hub of our community for skating, hockey as well as many community events.

I completely understand that the Tri-Township arena is dated and likely needs a number of upgrades and improvements to meet current standards, including AODA requirements. A proposed closure of this building in 2022 is shocking, and quite difficult to digest.

My 10 year old son and his friends started a petition this past weekend (posted at the arena, and featured on CTV news) and staged a bike rally in protest of the potential closure of the arena.

I am curious what the strategy has been for the Tri-Township Arena to date. For an aging facility, I would be interested in what has been budgeted and forecasted for improvements to date. The AODA requirements have been established for some time.

A few concerns that I have with the recreation study/plan:

- There was extremely limited public engagement, which seemed to focus on the collection of background information regarding existing facilities.
- Public engagement MUST include the review of alternatives in order to be a fair and transparent process.
- The size and demographics of Mount Brydges has changed very much since the plan was completed in 2015/2016.
- Municipalities have a "duty to consult" with First Nations. The Chippewas of the Thames First Nation, Delaware Nation of the Thames and Oneida Nation of the Thames, should have been consulted with as part of this plan/strategy, as well as any other infrastructure planning project.

I can understand the financial advantages of centralizing recreational assets. There are, however, a number of disadvantages of having the major Strathroy-Caradoc arena and gymnasium facilities located at Gemini Sportsplex:

- The Gemini Sportsplex is NOT centrally located in our municipality. It is located at the edge of Strathroy and NOT easily accessible by transit. A traffic assessment may very likely be required to accommodate projected travel volumes to this location.
- You severely limit the number of users and types of recreational facilities based on this location.

I really struggle with why recreational assets couldn't have been evaluated on a Middlesex County basis to better allow for improved future planning. The YMCA ideally would have been a key stakeholder in this planning process as well. I'm sure the Glencoe area is in a similar situation to the Tri-Township arena, in terms of facility age and condition.

The Tri-Township Arena, when it was originally constructed, was a partnership between three townships. We need to consider partnerships to strengthen and NOT limit our recreational amenities for both present and future users. An arena is an important public infrastructure facility that requires careful public consultation/engagement, planning and potentially securing federal and provincial funding.

I understand that Council plans to form a sub-committee and reconvene on the future of both the Tri-Township arena and the West Memorial Arena in June. One month is an insufficient amount of time to properly and thoroughly conduct any type of meaninging public engagement/consultation and planning/assessment.

I implore Council members and staff to make any further recreation review as thorough and transparent as possible.

Hello Neil,

I appreciated reading your heartfelt and well thought out email a friend shared with me today.

I read the consultant's report last week on the town website but the additional report by municipal staff helps provide more information.

I am curious as to why in the accounting ledger there is no indication of projected and/or current revenues of current user group rentals that help defray the costs of the municipality.

I too am not in favour of the eradication of a much used and needed enclosed town arena. A covered pavilion would not suffice in our erratic winters or even year round especially with the ongoing climate changes.

The population growth rates of the town would suggest that the continued need for an enclosed arena will only continue to grow especially with the 400 new homes planned in the near future along Parkhouse. If the decision is made to eliminate the current arena by the Spring of 22 what does that mean for the current users? Would they have a new structure set to go to replace the one they take down?

I have not seen a replacement plan yet, ready to hit the ground running, for when Covid alleviation allows, for the much utilized seniors centre in Strathroy that was apparently used by other age groups according to local sources but suddenly shuttered, declared surplus and put up for sale within the last year.

I understand why there is no plan for an indoor swimming facility that apparently was a much asked for facility in the survey due to the costs points. But I really don't understand the logic? behind taking such a well used building, the arena, down in our community though as well as potentially the community center

I am also wondering if there has been any contingency fund by the municipality for ongoing needed maintenance, replacements of current structures or upgrades and creations of new structures that has been factored in and collected to date from all of the new and rapidly growing single unit residential developments that are occurring in Mount Brydges? Is that new development money collected staying in Mount Brydges or being redistributed across Strathroy Caradoc?

I have been told that the reason for the under utilization of the Caradoc community center by local service groups and or individuals is directly a result of the exhorbitant user fees, again this is by word of mouth.

I will watch with interest the council meeting on the 12th.

To All Strathroy-Caradoc Council:

I am very concerned with the direction that Nustadia Recreation Inc. is recommending in their report to Council regarding suggested actions to be taken on the Tri-Township arena in Mt. Brydges and the West Memorial Centre in Strathroy. As a long-time resident of Mount Brydges, my focus is on future recreational facilities for our growing village. In particular, I quote the following from your Council report of May 12, 2021 – CS-2021-06...

Community Wellbeing – Residents of all ages in Strathroy-Caradoc will have access to community amenities and activities that are accessible and support active lifestyles and wellbeing.

I will begin with some information on the growth of Mt. Brydges in the past ten years. Numbers given are from Statscan's census reports of 2011 and 2016.

- In 2011, Mt. Brydges had 1834 residents as reported in that year's census.
- In 2016, Mt. Brydges had 1842 residents as per the 2016 census. These residents lived in 680 residential dwellings of which 610 were detached homes. Average occupants per dwelling was 2.7 persons.
- The 2021 census is currently underway and figures will no be available until 2022 or later.

Since the 2016 census, the population growth and homebuilding in Mt. Brydges have seen unprecedented growth and there seems to be no slowing down. According to my information, the following subdivisions have been approved...

1.	Woods Edge Subdivision	270 homes
2.	South Creek Subdivision	214 homes
3.	Edgewood Subdivision, Phase 1	82 homes
4.	Condos at Community Centre	70 homes
5.	Lions Gate Subdivision	68 homes
6.	Behind Auto Spa off Adelaide Road	38 homes
7.	Area north of Glendon and west of Queen St.	61 homes
Subtot	al	803 homes

If we use the average occupants per household number from the 2016 census (2.7), this will add 2168 residents to our population since 2016, a 117 percentage increase in population, or well over double our 2016 population.

Also, the following are under consideration at this time....

- Phase 2 of Edgewood Subdivision estimated 100 homes
- Sifton development at corner of Parkhouse Drive and Rougham Rd estimated 200 homes
- Land area north of village bound by Falconbridge, Rougham and Adelaide Road estimated 200 homes

Using the same number of occupants per household (2.7), this will add a further 1350 residents to our village. I estimate that the total population in Mt. Brydges by the year 2031 will be over 5,300.

I return to the following....

Community Wellbeing – Residents of all ages in Strathroy-Caradoc will have access to community amenities and activities that are accessible and support active lifestyles and wellbeing.

How does it make sense then to cut back on community amenities when you see that the community is growing at unprecedented rates in housing and population. Surely you can foresee that we need to expand our amenities, not shrink them. Isn't the better solution to build a new arena/community centre over the next few years while keeping the current one operational while controlling costs? What good will it be for community of our size to have no ice pad for use by various sport programs? How many parents are going to sit outdoors to watch their child play a hockey game? Or how many parents will sit outdoors to watch their child practise or compete in figure skating. We will be the laughing stock of the area for sure when outsiders attend competitive events.

Regarding an indoor sporting field that is half the size of regulation fields, what use will it have. No one will rent it for their teams as it makes no sense unless it is of regulation size.

The answer is NOT for us to drive to Strathroy or Komoka. Our growing community should have its own proper-sized facilities to serve its residents and their families. After all, with 804 (and growing) new property taxes coming into SC coffers, the money should be spent here and not in other communities. It seems to be a trend where the town of Strathroy gets more and Mt. Brydges is an afterthought.

Nustadia Recreation Inc.'s recommendation should be set aside as it is not looking at the future of this community. So much has changed in the past five years and will continue to change for the next five years. Their plan does not seem to have a horizon other than to consolidate and control costs. That is not always the right answer.

Re: Recreation Infrastructure Renewal Planning

Thank you for reaching out to the Mt. Brydges Lions Club with regards to the Recreation Infrastructure Renewal Plan. The Mt. Brydges Lions Club has been actively serving our community since 1948 and we look forward to working with the Municipality as we now consider the infrastructure renewal for the next 25 years.

With regards to the Nustadia Recreation Inc. Report, we agree with many of the councillors that recommendation #1 (the decommissioning of Tri-township arena by Spring 2022) should be rejected. That is not to suggest that we feel that the building itself should remain, which was a point well made by Mayor Vanderheyden. Instead, the Mt. Brydges Lions Club adopts the position taken by Councillor Neil Flegel that Mt. Brydges needs a multi-use arena facility that will meet the needs of our growing community.

From reviewing the Nustadia Report we note that their recommendation to close the Tri-Township arena suffers from several shortcomings, including:

• *Reliance on Dated Census Data*: We agree with Councillor Marie Baker in her comments during the May 12th Council meeting where she rejected outright a report that is based solely on a business model, noting that this report is only as timely as the 2016 census data that was used. As was fairly conceded by Fred and Rob during the May 12th Council

Meeting, their report was based upon census data that underestimated the unprecedented growth that is currently being seen in Mt. Brydges.

- *The Intrinsically Flawed Public Survey*. We agree with Councillor Neil Flegel observation that the public survey was intrinsically flawed as it gave the impression to participants that they were being asked to envision what additional resources (such as an indoor swimming facility) should be added to the community. The unintentionally misleading structure of the survey gave a sense that current resources would be maintained. Given this weakness, there should be little to no weight placed upon the public survey; and
- Industry Trends that do Not Reflect the Needs of our Community: While industry trends may prove accurate for larger cities, we agree with Councillor Sandi Hipple who noted that we are not seeing a decreased interest in ice sports in our community.

During the May 12th Council Meeting, Deputy Major Brad Richards identified the greatest failing of the Nustadia Report when he noted that an arena is more than just cement and ice, it is the hub our of community. The idea of moving the hub of our community to Strathroy so that a third pad of ice can be added to a 20-year old facility is ludicrous. Setting aside the fact that the current resources are inadequate to handle the displaced users of the tri-township arena, which was a point well made by Councillors Baker and Hipple, the current unprecedented growth in Mt. Brydges demonstrates a need to invest in our community. While centralizing infrastructure into Strathroy by investing in their aging facilities may make sense from a number's perspective, it ignores the need of the Mt. Brydges community that is currently experiencing explosive growth.

In terms of diversification, the "one ice pad" criticism is a perspective that fails to consider the imagination of small-town volunteer organizations. Before the pandemic the Mt. Brydges Lions Club held three movie nights in the park with one of those evenings taking place inside the Tri-Township Arena as weather did not allow for us to play the movie outside. We had children and adults of all ages attend and participate in this event. We raised money for the Caradoc Public School as well as Scouts Canada. This event had nothing to do with hockey or figure skating but had everything to do with bringing our community together. Before the pandemic, we had plans to repeat that same event, inside the arena, noting that with the inside venue we could hold the event in the late spring and start the movie sooner.

Any community infrastructure requires community support by way of sponsors and volunteers. The current infrastructure, despite the Tri-township arena's age has an army of volunteers demonstrating its need and use. Those volunteers support the organizations that then bring the financial sponsors. It is difficult to see the same volunteer base for a proposed facility whose coming marked the end of the Bulldogs, Minor Hockey, figure skating and our dedicated Skating Club. The Mt. Brydges Lions Club will not support an infrastructure renewal plan that abandons

these important community resources. It seems clear that our local businesses will take the same approach.

We will support an infrastructure plan that builds a new arena for Mt. Brydges as part of a multiuse facility. We would like to see the multi-use facility include the consideration of an update to the Caradoc-Community Centre. The diversification of recreational opportunities referenced in the Nustadia Report can still be achieved (although on a lesser scale) by upgrading the community centre to allow for greater and more varied use. The monies planned for the centralization of hockey to Strathroy is better spent in Mt. Brydges. The proposed indoor sports field would be better used at the Gemini Sportsplex, given its proximity to the high school. This is the plan that several Councillors referenced during the May 12th meeting. It is a plan that respects the needs of our community but also of the need of our neighbours, including The Chippewa of the Thames First Nation. The Mt. Brydges Lions Club believes that this is a plan that the community and local businesses will support. It is a plan worth fighting for.

In conclusion, the Mt. Brydges Lions Club stands with our hockey teams, figure skating team and Skating Club that have so enriched our community. We should not so lightly disregard our community's dedicated volunteers. Our community is not the building, but it is the teams, clubs, volunteers and families that call our arena home.

October 2019, a horrific car accident took the life of our 18 yr old son on Glendon Road. Our life was shattered. Immediately, our community of DelKoBridge took care of us. As a child, my son Tyler would always sign off his name with 873. 87 being his hero Sidney Crosby's hockey number and 3 being Tyler's hockey number. After the accident we learned that he still continued to use these numbers for various passwords.

With this information, a business person in this area, created an 873 sticker fundraiser for hockey helmets. Hockey clubs from all over were purchasing the stickers, hockey families that did not even know us, reached out to support us.

The biggest support however came from our community... DelKoBridge.

This is more than an old arena, this is the center of the DelKoBridge community with both hockey and figure skating families. All of our friendships began and have centered around the Mt Brydges Arena.

To substitute this with anything less is disadvantageous to the children.

The Tyler Coleiro 873 Foundation was created last year to give back to our community. The one purpose for this Foundation is to financially assist families from the DelKoBridge community to get children involved in sport.

Covid has made fundraising very difficult but because of the people living in DelKoBridge they have contributed over \$10,000 already! This is money that is ready to be shared with disadvantaged families in this area! Particularly for enrollment in the hockey and skating clubs at Mt Brydges Arena. We cannot wait to share this money once sports are allowed again.

Please reconsider your proposal, this arena is the heart of the DelKoBridge community. This local arena is what gives our area uniqueness and character.


In Memory of Tyler Coleiro

Rising from the fact that Strathroy-Caradoc has a number of aging facilities that are reaching their end of life, council hired Nustadia, a third party recreation expert to deliver a report on a vision moving forward. The report includes public and user group feedback, community census data, industry trends, and facility condition assessments.

The report makes clear the need for diversity in our recreation offerings. The data gives us information to guide us as we put together an infrastructure renewal strategy moving into the future. Council has not decided on any of the recommendations; it will take some time to come up with a plan that encompasses the needs of our entire community. Through all of these discussions and reports, we must have a plan in place for our community to proceed within a responsible financial framework, with an eye towards servicing a variety of ages from seniors to youth programming and to provide a variety of amenities. There is absolutely nothing easy about making any decisions and there are an abundance of differing opinions on the needs and wants of our residents.

My name is Mikayla Timmermans and I have been a proud member of Mount Brydges since my family moved here when I was 10. I am now 23 and can say that the majority of my life has been spent at the Tri-Township Arena. Myself, along with my 2 brothers have been on skates since we were 2 and when we moved to Mount Brydges, I became a member of the Mount Brydges Skating Club and my brothers joined the Mount Brydges Cougars. I skated competitively in singles for the skating club and was also a member on the Mount Brydges Magic Blades synchro team, in fact I still am.

The Mount Brydges arena is not only where I grew up but now is where I work. This past season was my sixth year of being a certified figure skating coach and I can confidently say that with the support of MBSC, I would not have the successful coaching career I have now. It has been a tremendous honour to go from student to coaching peers with my coach Chrissy Kernaghan as well as go through that transition with one of my greatest friends, Shayna McFadden. The people I have met at the Mount Brydges arena have become more than just friends, they are family.

Mayor and Councilors,

I am writing to you on behalf of my family who have lived in Mt. Brydges since 1997. As residents of this town we feel extremely concerned and disappointed with regards to what impact the closure of the Tri-Township arena would have on Mt. Brydges as it is the heart of our community. Both my sons had the opportunity to play for the Mt. Brydges Cougars and because of that made lifelong friends and learned skills that will stay with them throughout adulthood. As parents we also formed a network of friends which continue to this day. My sons also learned how to skate at that arena as we took advantage of the no-cost moms and tots skates which contributed to their physical and mental well being. They also were part of the learn to skate program prior to joining the Cougars hockey club. They then secured jobs at the arena as time keepers, ticket sellers at the gate and my oldest went on to become a referee as well. Having the arena close by meant that we could take advantage of all of these offerings without the need for transportation to access them.

As a past member of the MBDAA I have first hand knowledge of what this arena means to the community and what critical services it provides. The de-commissioning of two indoor arenas to add one to the Gemini simply won't work for the needs of this community. As a board member, we struggled to provide needed ice time to our hockey club having to direct teams to Glencoe and as far away as Aylmer arenas to meet their needs, and this was already five years ago! Ice time at the Wellness Centre was prioritized for the EMC hockey club, the Ilderton Skating club, as well as camps and various programs offered by Middlesex Centre. The argument was that our club, being in Strathroy-Caradoc, needed to access the ice availabilty in that area. It stands to reason that there will not be enough ice time to support the MBDAA, the Mt. Brydges Bulldogs club, the Magic Blades skating club, the adult skating club and the Old Timers recreation league if one arena is removed from the equation. Will that mean the folding of these clubs? An amalgamation with Strathroy Minor Hockey with regards to the MBDAA and the skating club? I can assure you that this is not what is wanted by the residents of this community. The population explosion in Mt. Brydges warrants the necessity of its own arena.

I find it rather perpelxing that amidst the proposed housing development, the report plans to decommission the Tri-Township arena. The township repeatedly states that having amenities and facilities is critical to this housing yet the report proposes to remove the arena which provides these amenities. This seems to be contradictory information and I am not understanding the logic. I am also very concerned about the impact this closure will have on surrounding businesses and the jobs that it provides for our local youth especially post-pandemic. The timing of this proposal could not be at a worse time with regards to the economic impact this will have on our community.

I respectfully ask you to consider all of the information I have presented to you and am available to discuss any points.

I am writing this letter to express my concerns regarding the proposed changes to the Tri-Township Arena in Mt. Brydges.

According to the proposal, this arena will be torn down and converted into an outdoor rink under the shelter of a pavilion. This would be hugely counterproductive to the development that is underway in this community. Mt. Brydges is currently undergoing extensive housing expansions in three corners of the town (Adelaide and Parkhouse, the condos by the Community Center, and the neighbourhood located just northeast of the current arena). The people moving into these homes, and the current residents of the town, would like to see their tax dollars stay in the community that they chose to call home, not have them sent to support recreation facilities in Strathroy. As a resident of Delaware West, our tax dollars go to the municipality of Strathroy-Caradoc. Sadly (and to our great frustration), we have noticed that the majority of that money is spent in Strathroy rather than our little subdivision in Delaware or in our neighbouring Mt. Brydges.

We have a son who has played Cougars hockey for the past decade. That little arena has been home to his first goal, his first penalty, his first tournament win, and his first feeling of belonging to something bigger than himself. His friends have worked their first jobs there, keeping the change rooms clean and assisting with the ice maintenance. What will happen to these opportunities for our children if the arena no longer exists? We have no desire to drive to Komoka or Strathroy to watch our child play on "home ice". The Mount Brydges Cougars belong in Mount Brydges. As does the local skating club, the Bulldogs, and the adult league who all make complete use of the available ice time. I am a resident of Mount Brydges, and I'm very concerned with the consultant report on recreation for the municipality. I fully appreciate this is only a consultant support and that they have no vested interest in the results. It is clear to me that it is simply a set of financial decisions and not about community.

Well I fully appreciate that the two communities are very different and unique we must treat recreation for both as independent of each other. Mount Brydges has always been associated with Del Ko Brydges, both in terms of community and sport. I appreciate this is not in keeping with the governance in which Mount Brydges is connected with. Strathroy is a rival in terms of sports and it would be unfair to merge programming between the two communities. I feel that the town of Strathroy, which is much larger and has higher representation in government, should not assume Mount Brydges residents want to attend activities in Strathroy. Especially when the proposed location is geographically located on the north end of the town which represents at least a 15 to 20 minute drive from Mount Brydges. This also assumes that the residents of Mount Brydges have a vehicle and puts the onus on parents to commit to an even further drive for activities.

I fully appreciate this is only a consultants report and would hope that you the elected officials would use reason when interpreting the results.

Of late it seems that many of the ideas being put forth for Mount Brydges are coming from non-residents who are unaware of what it's like to live in a small town.

Our town just has a tradition of small town hockey and skating clubs, which would not be possible if our only arena is in Strathroy.

Strathroy Caradoc's recreation department needs to be re-thought. The department should not be providing services but allowing community groups to do so.

I am also fundamentally opposed to adding on to the Gemini. If a new multipurpose facility should be built, it should be outside Strathroy on 81 highway towards Mount Brydges, to service both communities. It should be similar to the Bostwick facility built in South London and run by the YMCA not the Strathroy recreational department.

I do not support the closure of the tri Township Arena or the Mount Brydges community center.

Dear Councillor,

I'm writing to you in support of keeping a hockey arena in Mt. Brydges. I grew up outside of London and commuted 20-minutes every Saturday morning and multiple times throughout the week to play hockey. The Mt. Brydges community welcomed us with open arms - we would often see the entire community show up in support of our hockey team during the OMHA playdowns. I was a member of the team that won the first OMHA championship in Mt. Brydges. I hold those memories close and remember all the friendships and stories of playing hockey in that old barn. I remember watching the Mt. Brydges Bulldogs and aspired to play for them one day. My sister started her hockey career playing for the boys team, as it offered a more competitive alternative than playing for the London Devilettes. I've taken my boys to the arena on a couple occasions to show them the old pictures, banners, and share stories.

Growing up in a hockey community and representing your town in league play and at tournaments is an honour. We established a number of intense rivalries with neighbouring communities, but also created a number of friendships over the years. Many people from other communities in Ontario only know Mt. Brydges for hockey and the talent that it has produced. By tearing down or re-purposing the arena, you are taking away the identity of the community and those that came before it. The population of Mt. Brydges continues to grow, but many of the residents don't know the long-standing history of the community or the integral part that minor hockey has played. While the argument might be made that children have opportunities by traveling to Strathroy, Glencoe or Komoka, not everyone is privilaged enough to have transportation or the support of their parents - having an arena nearby would allow them to participate in minor hockey, skating lessons, figure skating and other activities. London continues to expand and I fear that smaller towns are losing their identity - personally, I don't want to become another Toronto.

I hope that you take into account the support that has come forward in keeping the Mt. Byrdges arena. While it may be in need of upgrades, the investment made to community infrastructure is an investment in future generations. The pandemic has taught us that the lack of sport (and other activities) has had an adverse effect on the physical, mental and social well-being of children and adults. By permenantly removing this fixture, you are diminishing the future welfare of this community.

All: I am writing today in response to the Nustadia proposal regarding recreational facilities in our community.

My husband has lived his entire 65 years in Mt. Brydges and I joined him 43 years ago. We made this our home, raised our family, and are proud to be residents of this wonderful town.

Reading through the Nustadia proposal (and, yes - I have read the entire document), I can't help but think that it was written by people who have never felt hometown pride. I certainly understand the need to spend taxpayer dollars in the most efficient way to support as many citizens in our community as possible. That said, it's important to note that Mt. Brydges is NOT Strathroy, despite our having to adopt the Strathroy-Caradoc moniker when our two towns were "merged" a few years back. You are probably hearing from a number of constituents that the people of our little town are feeling very second-hand to the Mayor and Council these days.

First of all, someone decided that our Cenotaph Park in the centre of town - a hub of activity on most days, with the splash pad and play equipment - would make a good place to plop an apartment building. Thankfully the town rallied to save that space and you were willing to listen and find an alternate location.

Now, a mere few months later, we learn that the plan is to de-commission the Tri Township arena, and that "Community indoor ice surfaces are proposed to be consolidated at a community recreation hub centred around Gemini Sportsplex." How are the citizens of this town supposed to react to this news when our precious arena has served as a central hub to this community for well over 40 years, without the population explosion that we are currently experiencing?!

The addition of facilities that are proposed in the plan would be most welcome, but not at the expense of our arena. Why should "we" have to travel out of town for hockey and/or figure skating when we have enjoyed the right to do so here at home for so many decades?

In reading the proposal, it "appears" that these plans have been justified by "data." Although I didn't take the survey (shame on me!), I question how it was worded. It didn't appear to me that it was an "either/or" situation, so most people responding were thinking more about what would be nice to have, not knowing that it would mean losing something very precious to our community. That, combined with the fact that

only 550 people responded to the survey, makes the "data" to support the plan very questionable.

What I find most concerning is the fact that, with all of the increased tax dollars coming from Mt. Brydges, the proposal is asking us to travel to Strathroy for hockey when we've had our own facility for over 40 years. Expansion of the Gemini Sportsplex will help the residents of Strathroy - not the residents of Mt. Brydges. Regarding "stakeholder feedback," I see that Steve Dausett was interviewed regarding the shape of the current arena, which we all know is old and in dire need of an upgrade. What other Mt. Brydges stakeholders were interviewed? The proposal was also based on 2016 information. We all know that the average house price in Mt. Brydges is closing in on \$500K - a far cry from the amount noted in the report - based on the exponential growth we're experiencing.

Also wondering...

- What role Nustadia Recreation will be playing in the execution of this project?
- Will the project(s) be put to tender or will Nustadia have full reign over execution?
- What alternatives were considered?
- Is there a way to build a new multi-pad arena/community centre in Mt. Brydges that would provide the benefits outlined in the proposal, without breaking the bank?

Sometimes, decisions of this nature shouldn't be made strictly on the financial viability of the project. As such, I would hope that you are all taking the time to listen to the feedback you're receiving and also taking into account the increase in tax dollars that Mt. B. has provided to Strathroy-Caradoc over the past number of years based on our exponential growth. It's time to quit thinking that the world revolves around Strathroy because, as noted, although we share a name, we are a separate town.

I'd like to end by sharing a very thoughtful message that my niece, Amy Cole posted on the weekend. I think she sums up nicely exactly what many of us are feeling about the proposal...

- Sorry this is going to be a long post! I don't think anyone can understand the meaning of small town life unless you have lived in one or grew up in one. Your neighbours become your family, the people you went to school with are your friends for life. You gather at the Caradoc Community Centre to celebrate graduations, weddings, sports banquets and fundraisers for your community and surrounding towns. You go to the ball diamonds, soccer fields and the arena to cheer on local kids-celebrate in their victories and console them in their losses. You get to witness the moments of watching their happiness enjoying the sports they love. You see these same faces and catch up at the grocery store the local legion, restaurants, the post office, and the park. These places are the heart and soul of a small town. Our Arena is now in jeopardy. This is the place where I learned to skate, and went to public skating every weekend. I watched my family and friends play hockey games and win OMHA championships there, I have seen the Bulldogs pack the stands. I have watched my friends in the skating carnivals and seen little ones learn to skate in the moms and tots program. It's where we took class trips to and it's where the old timers play each Sunday. The arena has served as a spot for many memorable BX93 video dance parties and the location for Rockin Wheel which has brought many great bands to town and again reuniting us with old friends. It has also been a spot for us not only to celebrate in but to mourn in as well. This arena is not only for Mt. Brydges it's for our surrounding communities such as Delaware, Campbellvale, Komoka, Melbourne, Chippewa, Muncey, and Oneida. Subject: Comments regarding Nustadia Report

Good morning

I am writing to you today with some concerns over the proposed recommendations as reported in the Nustadia Report. I am a resident of Campellvale for over 45 years. Both my husband and I have been involved in recreation in the community at various levels throughout that time. I am currently, and have been for the last 20 years, involved with older adult programing and activities not only locally but throughout the province.

One of my main concerns is the lack of older adult appropriate facilities in Mount Brydges, thus a lack of activities for this 55+ age group. There seems to be little mention of the older adult demographic in the recent (although seemingly outdated) report that is to be discussed at council this week.

My background includes involvement in the local District 29 of the Ontario Senior Games Association since 2003 as an annual event organizer and chair of the 2013 Southwest Regional Games for over 700 participants that was held in Strathroy - Caradoc and surrounding area. I also was on the Board of the OSGA for over 15 years including President for 6 years. I believe strongly that the 55+ demographic are often overlooked when municipalities are planning, often due to an emphasis on youth. The older adult's needs are somewhat different and as a result require different considerations.

At present, there is few, if any, programs for older adults in the Mount Brydges area. They tend to be hit and miss, depending on either the legion, church groups or individuals to initiate. One of the most important issues is the lack of appropriate facilities. In my travels throughout the province I have seen many communities with well organized programs and facilities for older adults, none of which is available in this area. I was even concerned to hear of the closing of the senior building in Strathroy, one that the OSGA has been associated with in the past.

It was noted in the report that the Mount Brydges Community Centre was deemed under used. In the past, attempts to use it for events has either proved to be too costly, unavailable for certain types of activities, difficulties in acquiring or lack of interest in hosting events. When planning activities for older adults in this area, choices are very limited.

It is my opinion that any changes/improvements in Mount Brydges recreational facilities must take in the needs of older adults as well as youth and younger adults.

This would involve developing an older adult program and facilities that would accommodate them. Keep in mind, this demographic is often made up of retirees who use the facilities in the daytime during the week. This report's recommendations do not meet the needs of this age group at all.

Many people's views of older adults are their needs are often inaccurate. They do need local programs but not all programs are sedentary such as cards etc.. There are many activities that are quite physical(bocce, carpet bowling, pickleball, badminton etc) and require the facilities to accommodate them.

I am presently involved with pickleball, which is the fastest growing sport in Ontario and even Canada. I am presently on the Board of Directors for Pickleball Ontario and run a year-round club of 100+ participants for 55+ in

Middlesex Centre. Many of our players are in the 70-80 range, trying to keep active and healthy.

This club also includes several residents of Mount Brydges and area. When I first approached Strathroy-Caradoc on forming the club in this area, there were several road blocks including no appropriate facilities, a lack of interest or co-operation from the recreational staff, cost and what I considered issues with trying to obtaining any consideration for lower rental fees. As a result, the club was not formed.

In looking over the report, it was noted that many of the statistics are very outdated, 2015?, which with the extent of the present rate of growth in the community, makes them almost irrelevant. The area's demographics is changing. This needs to be taken into consideration.

Although I am focused on older adults, I do see, as a former physical education teacher, the need for improved facilities and programming for youth but also feel that the other age groups should not be overlooked nor left out in order to provide for younger people. All aspects of the community need to be serviced.

My personal wish would be to see a older adult facility be incorporated within any proposed plans and an effort be made to develop a program to accommodate the different needs of the older adults as well as other demographics. A multi-use facility with room for all ages would be appropriate.


More thought needs to be put into any recommendations to ensure they will meet the needs of all of the community far into the future.

Dear Mayor Joanne Vanderheyden & Council Members,



My name is Lawson Crouse. I'm a Mount Brydges native. I grew up on Helen Street. That photo above is seven year old me, all smiles, suited up to play with the Cougars at the Mount Brydges Arena (Tri-Township Arena). The cougars were the first team I ever played for, and the Tri-Township Arena is where it all began.

This arena is where my passion for hockey started, but it served more than just that purpose. It was the foundation of my understanding of what it meant to be a part of a team; to be a part of the community. I met lifelong friends here, many of those friends I'm still close with to this day. My family gathered here to watch each other play. My two older sisters developed on this same ice. To me the arena is more than just a rink, it was a place for my mom, dad, sisters, grandparents, cousins, friends, and neighbours to gather together, and share our love for the game. I speak from my personal experience, knowing that I share the same passion as many other families in the town of Mount Brydges. I know this because I've received countless messages from the community expressing their grief, and worry for what's to become of the arena, the hockey community, and skating club in our hometown. Members of the community began reaching out to me with hopes my voice could help carry their message loud and clear. I know many have reached out on their own behalf as well to plead their case. Our hope is that my story can be a testament to the value the rink holds in our town, not only to myself, but to the hockey community.

In 2013 I was drafted 5th overall by the Kingston Frontenacs of the OHL. I represented our country of Canada a handful of times, including the 2015 World Juniors where I brought my gold medal back home to Helen Street. My Team Canada Jersey still hangs from the rafters in the Tri-Township Arena. It doesn't hang there to sing any song of my success. It hangs there for the kids in Brydges to see a future. I started as a Mount Brydges Cougar, and in 2015 I became a Florida Panther of the NHL. Since then I've played 5 years pro with the Arizona Coyotes. I've always dreamt of the day I could bring the Stanley Cup back to the Tri-Township Arena, should I be fortunate enough, and to show the kids in this community what hard work and a dream can do for you.

What are we doing for these kids if this proposal is approved? We're not knocking down a meaningless building to generate updated infrastructure, we are robbing them of opportunity, experience, happiness, community, the list goes on. I know how much there is to be gained from this arena. I am living proof. I always dreamed of playing in the NHL, and having an arena down the road is what made that possible. This arena is where I fell in love with the game of hockey. My mom and dad were able to get me over to practice in the early hours of the morning before school, and late hours of evening after their long work days. There were so many sacrifices to come as I grew, and got better; but having a local arena meant their time wasn't always one of them. Without that access, I wonder how many kids will lose out on the opportunity to chase their dreams.

When it comes to competitive sports you take away so much more than the skill. You learn discipline, sacrifice, leadership, collaboration, hardship. You learn the lesson of failure, but gain the knowledge of perseverance; you learn how to succeed, but remain humble. These small town life lessons take you so much further on the grand scheme of things. The more arenas we take away, the more the kid's in the community will suffer the lack of opportunity to play competitive hockey. In turn this means the lack of opportunity to learn the invaluable lessons I mentioned above.

Adding one pad to Gemini will not suffice. I have been in hundreds of minor hockey rinks throughout my youth, spending hours on end. I can tell you from personal experience it will not be enough. Mount Brydges' population is growing. They deserve the opportunity to succeed and have competitive hockey to grow with them.

I've seen the lack of resources taint the ability for the game to grow first hand. This is an ongoing issue here in Arizona where I play professionally. It's something I am always looking to aid. I want the local youth to have the same growth, and opportunity that I had in Brydges for our current and coming generations. I want them to blow my accomplishments out of the water. If this proposal were to be approved, I can say in confidence, as someone who has had success from a minor to a professional, that it won't happen.

I completely disagree with this proposal. We are taking away so much more than just a rink. You are taking away their path to success, and their opportunity to grow. In an attempt to grow the community in other sectors, you are placing a roadblock, and a burden on the local hockey organization. I know it is hard for everyone to relate to what I am saying, but as someone who has reaped the benefits of having a local rink; I know this would be a huge mistake.

At the end of the day I want what is best for the greater good, but I couldn't let this decision pass without bringing awareness to what this rink has done for my life, and my family. I know keeping the rink would have the same impact on others. I am begging you Mayor Vanderheyden and council members to consider the impact this will have on many families in Mount Brydges. I hope this letter is well received, and sheds light on the countless benefits of having a local rink.

My name is Fred Warriner, and I wish to respond to the Nustadia Report and the resulting recommendations. My family and I took up residence in a new neighbourhood in Mt. Brydges in 1968 and have enjoyed every minute of it, never found a reason to leave. At the time, we had an outdoor ice rink located in the current Cenotaph Park; the accompanying change house is still there although it has since been repurposed. Those who wanted to skate could, provided the weather cooperated and the volunteer firemen flooded the ice surface. Those who wanted to play hockey or wanted to participate in a skating club had to travel to Glencoe to use their indoor rink (which I might add is still in use because of thoughtful and reasonable maintenance). We had a Town Hall that was built a very long time ago and was considered by many to be past its prime. The Scouts, Cubs, Brownies, Girl Guides and other groups made good use of the hall, in addition to adult events and community movies. In time the need for change became obvious and, through volunteerism, we were able to acquire the current Tri Township Arena and the Community Center. My family, who are probably typical of many others in the community, made good use of both facilities. In fact, you will find bricks in the commemorative wall of the Community Center purchased by families to ensure its construction and maintenance.

The arena is the heart and soul of our community. It is the one place residents can go to enjoy winter activities. It must not be decommissioned. The fact that it might need to be rehabilitated is not sufficient reason in my opinion to eliminate it. The comment that it is undersized is ridiculous. It is certainly large enough to run most skaters and players out of breath, and I don't expect Mt. Brydges has any desire to lure a professional hockey team into town. In fact, it has proven large enough to help develop home grown players into the pro ranks.

There is so much in the Nustadia Report, which is based on dated five year old data, that does not take into account the health and wellbeing of the Mt. Brydges community. The community in which I live has gone through periods of transition. When we moved to town it had an abundance of children. The last decade or so not so much. But take a look outside now; there is a residential construction boom taking place which is resulting in many more families with children relocating to Mt. Brydges. It is imperative that Strathroy-Caradoc look to the future of both Strathroy and Caradoc, and also MT. BRYDGES.

I believe that our arena should remain regardless of the maintenance costs. Those costs will likely be less than the cost of building a third ice surface in Strathroy, in an area that is so removed from Mt. Brydges to not be worthy of consideration. With all due respect I urge that you all give your heads a shake.

Subject: Proposed Recreation Facility Infrastructure Renewal

I am writing this note following what has been a weekend of thinking and reflecting on the above project which has been subject to much communication since it was published/ shared late last week. I will introduce myself so it is fair for you to understand my bias/ and perhaps ability to understand the report as it is presented.

I am a resident of Strathroy Caradoc. Although I work in the town of Strathroy, I do live located almost an equal distance between both Strathroy And Mount Brydges. As a family we have accessed both towns for recreational activities, and I did participate in the survey completed in the Fall of 2020. From a volunteer basis, I am a member of the Holy Cross Parent Council and I am the current Test Chair for the Mount Brydges Skating Club and a local parent supporter of many groups to which our children have been involved with for about the last 16 years.

There are three major areas in which I will want to comment on, perhaps ask questions, and ask that thought be taken within this renewal process. They include: the survey process, support for those groups impacted by the proposed changes and the idea for the promotion of the sense of community.

Firstly, when I read the report overall, I was pleasantly surprised that it appeared to address the need for physical activity and recreation for all ages. I do find that there are current limits for adult recreation via municipal facilities presently in Strathroy Caradoc. As I recall in the survey it did make a great effort to include all demographics age wise, so thank you. However, I was concerned when I saw the minimal number of residents that completed the survey. Although I do not want to get my statistics textbook out, I do wonder about the statistical significance of these numbers. As I began to ask around to see how many people I know if they had responded, I was shocked at the number who had stated they "never received it". I have now later learned that for many, it went to their "spam". Email is certainly an efficient way to send large numbers of communications out to others, but we have to make sure they get to the intended people. It troubles me for the same reason that some stakeholders did not get their say, because they did not get the email invitation due to spam, again leading to miscommunication and lack of input. I question what was the followup process for this? Was there one? I realize these projects and phases are time sensitive, but we need to make sure to make decisions based on accurate information.

In reviewing the draft report from Nustadia, it appears that most of the statistics used related to

that from 2016. Again based on the current trends and housing developments approved by council for both Strathroy and Mt Brydges, I just want to make sure that some correction has been taken into consideration. I am concerned with the increased pressure on our existing local arenas with the excitement around the introduction of the Strathroy Jets and implication on ice time required. At the local Komoka Arena we have seen the introduction of the Montreal Ice Academy with Scott Moir which will be growing with national and international trained athletes who will require ice - a branch also of the Ilderton Skating Club- Competitive Skaters who is a major user of that facility. I am not a personal stakeholder but even the little knowledge I have makes me wonder if this has all been taken into consideration.

Secondly, I question if there has been any thought to how to support the impacted programs. The programs that currently run from the West Middlesex Memorial Centre will have some time to plan, in that they will remain open for five more years, and likely feel some absorption with the new pad being built at the Gemini. With planning required, how do the current programs at the Tri Township Arena get absorbed, or find a home? There is little extra ice time with the current programing with four ice pads. Essentially they will have their final season (2021) to process and organize within a year, where a pandemic allows little to be planned with any guarantees. My major concern for both the Tri Township Arena and the West Middlesex Memorial Centre, is that many recreational programs will be lost. Sport is not just to be endorsed and built around competitive teams and organizing tournaments. Sport facilitates basic physical, emotional and social development at all ages. One of the best examples of the true passion of sport is seeing the men's rec league leave the Tri Township Arena where the average age is probably 65 years of age. They show up for the comradery, recreation and passion for sport. I feel that many children will be impacted with the lack of local access to ice time. Not every family has the resources for competitive sport and not every child desires to be part of a competitive league but can still benefit from the experience of recreational sport. This greatly concerns me.

Thirdly, I would like to touch on the promotion of the sense of community. Since moving to the Municipality over twenty years ago, as a new member I had to find a way to belong. This was done through many ways; work, school, faith and recreation. However with amalgamation of many things, municipalities, school boards, hospitals and even churches this can be more difficult today. Where traditionally people would find it in faith and other venues, many families find themselves at arenas and they become family with others of the common interest - their children. Recreation has always kept a sense of community strong, but in Mount Brydges the Tri Township Arena seems to be the glue that keeps the community together in many ways, especially for families. In Mount Brydges I believe It is probably the only physical structure that gathers the most people. In times of celebration and great loss, a community always needs a place to gather. We need to ensure the health of the community spirit for all of Strathroy Caradoc - that includes Mount Brydges..

I will be virtually present for the meeting on Wednesday. Your job as an elected council is to ensure the proper process has been undertaken for all decisions. I trust that you will do what is in the best interest of all citizens of Strathroy Caradoc. I look forward to clarification, and appreciate the time taken to hear my concerns.

Our daughter started playing hockey for Mount Brydges Cougars when she was 6. Sadly her hockey career was short lived, but she had the opportunity to learn new skills and be part of a great hockey association. Our son has played Cougars hockey for the last 5 years. He has had the opportunity to learn how to play hockey and be a team player thanks to the wonder coaches and well run Cougars Hockey Association. Having an Arena in Mount Brydges is key to providing children of the community the opportunity to participate in hockey and skating with other children from their surrounding communities (Komoka, Kilworth, Melbourne, Chippewa, Delaware). Removing the Arena from would have a profound effect on families all of these communities.

An outdoor ice pad is not a replacement for an arena. It is a novelty, but not suitable for practices, training and games on a regular basis. Even if it is covered.

Good Evening,

This email is being sent to all members of council as well as our Mayor to voice our family's concerns about the proposed recommendation to tear down the Tri-Township Arena.

My name is Sarah Hogeveen and I have been a resident of Mt Brydges for almost 10 years and have been very welcoming of the new developments and changes to our small village. However, this is the first year where I felt I needed to share my opinion so much on the drastic changes being proposed in our community - 1st with the low income housing unit in our park and 2nd now the possibility of taking away our community hub in our local arena.

Please do not take the heart of our small town! Please don't make our families have to break our children's hearts even more this year, we are all struggling and this was one of the places that brought hope and joy to our kids, even when the hockey and skating season looked very different this year. Yes, my family is avid users of the Tri Township arena and have been for many years. We have two children in Cougars hockey, my husband coaches, I skate for Magic Blades as an adult and our family is well involved when Caradoc PS uses the rink multiple times throughout the winter. We also take the time to attend our local Bull Dogs games and even rent the ice as a family to bring our friends and family together during the holidays.

I have read over the report and reread it multiple times. I kept thinking am I missing something, how can there just be one recommendation for us and it closes two arenas? What happened to options? Why couldn't the report reflect any options for the council to move forward with reviewing instead of one recommendation which will NOT serve the needs of our community. I even participated in the survey as a resident and feel like it doesn't represent the data correctly or it was misrepresented when completing the survey. I guarantee anyone in our town if they had the choice would NOT have suggested losing our arena at the cost of a new facility.

The data in the report contradicts itself and needs to be updated to reflect the current reality of our community. This town is continuing to grow with young families every day. I guarantee the largest demographic right now is NOT 50-59 and the average home is NOT

\$284K, as outlined in the report from 2016. If you look at the survey data (which was the largest survey completed to date by residents as stated in the news) the main demographic are families with young children or youth in highschool.

The report also mentions the importance of partnerships and how these partnerships are essential for the success of projects like this. What about the other 'partnerships' we already have that are being ignored or tossed aside without any thought? Where do these organizations fit in? They have been supporting our community and providing our kids with some of the best memories of their lives. (MB Cougar, MB Figure Skating Club, MB BullDogs, Magic Blades, Men's Hockey, Rockin' Wheel, etc...) Tri Township is also run in partnership with the Anishinaabeg of the territory of Deshkaan Ziibing, also known as Chippewas of the Thames First Nation. There is no mention of this partnership whatsoever in this report, huge oversight!

I was also very disappointed to see that not one of the two figure skating organizations was contacted to be part of the interview process. There is representation from baseball, volleyball, hockey and even the Strathroy Dance club? Where is the representation for two figure skating clubs?

As is, all our groups struggle to get sufficient ice time. There are 500 children/youth who participate in MB Cougars and because there isn't enough ice time here we also use ice time at Komoka Wellness Centre, where it is STILL a challenge to get enough ice time with their organizations. (Komoka also houses Ilderton Skating club, Middlesex Elgin Chiefs, Komoka Kings Hockey)

Perhaps the greatest challenge is that Mount Brydges, which is the second largest community in the Municipality, serves not only the municipality's residents, but those of Middlesex Centre also - hence "Tri Township". Most activities in the area (including some schooling) cover Delaware, Komoka and Mount Brydges - known locally as DelKo Brydges. Although they aren't voting members in our community I know our friends in Delaware, Komoka and Kilworth are all very upset and affected by this outcome.

We understand that the Tri Township arena is old and needs to be updated and the reality is that it might not be repairable. What we are here to make sure is that our small town keeps an indoor arena facility in our community.

The Tri Township Arena has been a second home for my family, we spend every weekend in the rink between the Cougars and MB Skating Club. We've watched our kids learn to skate, shoot the puck, and make friends, but we've also watched our kids learn hard work, dedication and what it feels like to be part of a team. In non-covid times, when one of our kids would be on the ice, the other would be playing with new and old friends and you always knew there was more than one person keeping an eye on the kids. It takes a village! We love our village.

If you take the arena out of Mt Brydges you will be taking the heart and soul out of our community. Please keep an arena in Mt Brydges. #MtBrydgesNeedsAnArena #NewArenaForMtBrydges

We are a family from Mount Brydges. My husband and I grew up in small towns and moved here knowing the small town feel is where we wanted to start our family and grow with them in the future. Moving to a small town with an arena was key on our check list as we both grew up playing local hockey and figure skating. Weekends skating with our families growing up were some out of best memories and we wanted to have that for our kids too. The Mount Brydges arena is where both our kids took their first strides with their dad and myself and where they now participate in figure skating with the MBSC and Cougars hockey. My husband and I also play adult rec league hockey in this arena too. The one thing our girls missed the most this past year due to COVID was our every Sunday family skate. And we as parents missed it too.

Taking away the one outlet and recreational activity we do as a family weekly is devastating not just for us but many kids. Especially kids who aren't in the group activities but can come out on Sundays to just be on skates without the high cost of competitive skating. My husband is a volunteer fire fighter and on his oncall weekends he isn't able to do the family day trips we try to get out for, so the ability to family skate on Sundays and run out for an emergency call but still allowing us to walk home from the arena while he rushes off with the vehicle is another bonus. We aren't stranded and family time doesn't suffer.

Thanks for the added info and response. I ask you or the others on your team this one question.

How does moving existing services away and adding additional services to Strathroy help serve Mount Brydges and surrounding rural areas? Strathroy is already a well developed area that has a seniors center and all sorts of recreational facilities with a broad range of diversity. Why should them become priority over the other surrounding areas?

It seems the recommendations does not provide what people are asking for or suite the interests of people outside of Strathroy. The signs around Mount Brydges, Delaware and rural areas voices a much different direction than what a third party consulting company can conclude.

Further thinking about the recommendation, I stress the need for organized activities in our community. Ones that have established leagues or clubs. Adding pavilions with out some organizations running them will sit empty as the younger generation (I include myself in this bracket) is not motivated to run events. We want to "play" when we have time in our very busy different lives which are much different than in the past. An indoor playing field like that of the pavilion will sit empty unless there are community organized events. Look at the existing community center which sits empty most of the time. I suspect this is why YMCA facilities like in Komoka tend to busier than municipality community centres as there is that organization putting on events and leagues. If a ice skating pavilion is put in it will be used for public skating and likely sticks and pucks will be prohibited. I suspect there isn't enough public skating alone in the community to justify the cost of building and maintaining this pavilion. Perhaps keeping the existing building may not seem like a bad idea until we have a better plan. A full plan that focus on what Mount Brydges and surrounding area needs vs giving Strathroy more when they already have so much.

Hi Everyone.

First and foremost I couldn't be happier to see the number of signs located through the Mount Brydges community in support of keeping or building a new arena. And then other day I happen to be passing through Delaware and Melbourne and was floored by the amount of signs in the surrounding towns.

Even saw a few in Strathroy area. I think the community has spoken and I'm sure you're seeing the same.

Regarding some of the proposed changes. I find it confusing that a report from 2016 seems to be the basis for what needs to be done when the community has changed drastically from 2016. While the need for maintenance on the building doesn't necessarily change. One would question that if the number of people in the community has increased significantly, that this would grant doing maintenance that may have previously been considered too costly for a community with less numbers.

I was also really shocked to hear a questionnaire was sent out. Sitting in on the meeting was the first that I've heard of this questionnaire. As a member of the community I would like to think that there is better awareness when conducting surveys for such important facilities. Was this mailed out?

I am also a bit confused how moving the arena to Strathroy Gemini makes sense for anyone other than Strathroy residents which already have numerous ice pads. Isn't the idea to have the facilities used as much as possible. Moving the arena there to have tournaments is focused on Friday/ Saturday/Sunday ice time not 7 days of week and forgetting about the community benefits. I happen to play hockey in the Gemini and the tri-township arenas for a few men's leagues. I frequently see empty ice at Gemini in the evenings when playing. It certainly doesn't grant adding another pad of ice.

I do think a lot of people are failing to realize what makes a community, a "community". The community is about treating people in your surrounding area like friends or neighbours. Being kind or neighbourly to the people in the town you live in. A community is about having a central heart or location where people come together to play, socialize, make and share memories, celebrate and be one. So while I do think it would be cool to see a new arena in Mount Brydges, it is more important to at least keep what we have. I think the discussion needs to be much greater than the consultants simply adding a pavilion where there will be no organization or community role models organizing community sports or events. We don't need basketball nets, they exist at the school. We don't need indoor soccer fields as there are several outdoor fields all over the place. But to take away an arena doesn't sit well with me as not only are you taking away something you are removing the organized community/sports portion. Mount Brydges needs a community hub or community center. The arena is definitely a piece of this so-called building or centre hub. Families come together while their kids play hockey or skate. Kids need a place to stay off the street and focus on positive things. A place to learn teamwork, respect and find out what makes them who they are. It provides a place to get their chance a being something great. Something kids and adults really could use with the past two years of dealing with a pandemic.

While I am sure it is not cheap, A recreational room conducive to holding meetings or other events and perhaps a kitchen that is part of the arena. A room big enough to hold events and replace the old community center which always seems to be empty as the design doesn't work with more than a meeting space.

I have played hockey in pretty much every small town in southern Ontario over my life. I think what truly brings a community together is walking into a arena which has a community centre attached to it and you see a whole variety of community events going on. It isn't just about the ice, or the hockey, or figure skating. It's about having a building that welcomes being a community. Having a pavilion is not welcoming, and will not increase community activities as there is no organization or body responsible for organizing those events.

Please reconsider keeping the arena. Mount Brydges needs a community arena more than Strathroy needs another ice pad.

It certainly doesn't grant adding another pad of ice.

Thank you K K for sharing your thoughts, concerns and memories with me. I am sending along a few brief notes on why we asked for a report, steps moving forward and a few links.

Rising from the fact that Strathroy-Caradoc has a number of aging facilities that are reaching their end of life, council hired Nustadia, a third party recreation expert to deliver a report on a vision moving forward. The report includes public and user group feedback, community census data, industry trends, and facility condition assessments.

The report makes clear the need for diversity in our recreation offerings. The data gives us information to guide us as we put together an infrastructure renewal strategy moving into the future. Council has not decided on any of the recommendations; it will take some time to come up with a plan that encompasses the needs of our entire community.

Through all of these discussions and reports, we must have a plan in place for our community to proceed within a responsible financial framework, with an eye towards servicing a variety of ages from seniors to youth programming and to provide a variety of amenities. Our committee of council will now digest the report and consult with all of our user groups. There is nothing easy about making any decisions and there are an abundance of differing opinions on the needs and wants of our residents.

I was born and raised in Mt Brydges. The Arena has been a part of my life for several years and it still is. From learning how to skate and how to play the game of hockey. Learning life skills from coaches and team mates, but most of all, learning how to win and learning how to lose. At the end of the day, life really is a team sport. Many of my first friends in life, were teammates first. Since hockey, these same teammates/ friends have been there for me while I've gone through times of winning in life and most importantly, times of loss in life.

The arena also provided some of my first jobs and responsibilities in life. I was a gate keeper, a time keeper, a referee and I have helped with player development and assisted in coaching. All of these roles played a big part of where I am in life today.

As a young child I had a very noticeable speech impediment that really impacted my life at a young age. Being made fun of at school and always being on edge it was difficult to ever speak in front of others, the anxiety was overwhelming. The sport of hockey encouraged me to do all of my talking on the ice without saying very many words at all. I was fortunate to be an above average player on my team, I felt like I was accepted and wanted without saying a word. The support around me was family like. I recall the days that we didn't have a practice or a game being very long and lonely. I couldn't wait to get my skates and helmet on to really come out of my shell.

I was part of a team that had the same coach for several years, Joe Michalski. Joe always treated me like a son and some days you didn't want to be family when "coach dad" was mad! They way he spoke to us like young hockey players with a bright future, the way he respected us as young men, the way he responded to us on and off the ice has forever held a place in my heart and to this day, Joe Michalski is a close friend that we still call "Coach".

We were for fortunate to make it to the all Ontario Finals 7 or 8 years in a row. I believe Mt.Brydges history was made when we won the Silverstick finals and made it to the International Silver Stick finals in St Clair Shores Michigan! We were also the first Mt Brydges team to win an all Ontario Championship. The very first time our team made it to the finals in Novice, we lost. I believe that was

1988/89. I was 8 years old. At the time, as much as it was a loss, we learned so much as a team!

The years to follow from 1990 to roughly 1995 we were reigning Ontario Champs.

Some of my greatest memories were family, friends and neighbours that came to watch us play and best of all, the teachers from our school who showed up to cheer us on in playoffs! Who knew at that age that teachers were real people too! The community support was incredible!

I still venture up to the arena when I hear of a local team that has made it to the All Ontario Finals. Better yet, I see teammates who are in the stands that have kids on the team. I make sure to wear the Blue felt with Mustard yellow leather sleeves "Mt Brydges Minor Hockey" the coat that was passed on to me by Billy "Backhoe" from when he was a well known coach and a gentleman of the community. Several people still recognize it as "Billy's coat".

I can only hope that many other residents of Mt Brydges have had some life long memories provided by the people in the arena and the community that surrounds it. My hope is that future residents of Mt Brydges, young and old will still be able to make memories in the near future.

Losing our rink would be devastating!

To this day, I still have a speech impediment. I also still have my teammates and coach beside me. There are still several words that I struggle to say and many situations that I'm afraid to speak up or say anything. However, on this matter, I will be heard! Whatever I can do to help the community keep our arena, I will!

On behalf of the Mount Brydges Skating Club (MBSC), we are extremely disappointed to hear that Council is debating the closure of the Tri-Township Arena.

For over 45 years, MBSC has called the Tri-Township arena home. Our many programs, lessons, competitions and carnivals have provided thousands of local skaters with the opportunity to participate in this great sport, develop friendships both on and off the ice, and bring the community together within this shared love for the sport. The arena has been a point of connection for the people of Mount Brydges - both through times of happiness, competition, celebration, and through immeasurable loss.

We believe that the opportunity for the sport of skating, in a town that continues to grow with so many new families, is extensive. Our programs continue to run at or near capacity - and extra ice time is already next to impossible to get. We need an arena to support our growing community -- and consolidating our continuously growing population into Strathroy is not the solution.

We have always felt that MBSC has been considered a major stakeholder of the Tri-Township Arena -- but it appears we are not. Where will our skaters find a home?

Over years MBSC has provided programming that has allowed many children to utilize our programs for their needs: whether it be learning to skate to support their skills required to enter the hockey world, or those skaters who spend years attaining the highest levels of Skate Canada Gold Standards. We are also the home of the Mount Brydges Magic Blades, who have been recognized by the Municipality of Strathroy Caradoc for their numerous championships both Regionally and Provincially. We have also had local skaters join National Junior Synchronized Skating Teams, who have been able to proudly represent Canada. Perhaps we don't brag enough. This passion and skill always starts locally. Without a local arena many children will never have this beginning opportunity.

Community Services, Councillors and Mayor,

I'm writing to express deep concern over the recent release of the Municipality of Strathroy-Caradoc's Recreation Facility Infrastructure Renewal Plan, which sets out to decommission the Tri-Township Arena next year.

The information in the Council Report is stale-dated and doesn't consider the recent growth of this town, with the addition of substantial amounts of residential development, including South Creek, the ever-expanding Woods Edge, Lion's Gate, and the upcoming Garden Grove, Timberview Trail, as well as multi-unit dwellings and other big projects that are in the works. With more households and people, we need MORE access to recreational options, not LESS.

I've seen the proposals for recreational upgrades coming this year, including tennis and pickleball courts, and this is great, but the ARENA is the heart of our community. The Canada Community-Building Fund is just that, a "community building" fund; it's NOT an excuse to take away the very thing that brings our community together! Recreational infrastructure needs to reflect the wants and needs of the community, which filters through the community itself, not a round table of people looking at numbers! Community partnerships need to be considered too, like the Lions etc.

On a personal level, I took my kids skating at Moms & Tots every Thursday morning when they were preschoolers. My son went on to play with the Mt. Brydges Cougars and has a collection of OMHA medals from the many years he has played with MBDAA. My daughter grew up skating with the Magic Blades, who almost always made the podium, leaving people asking "where the heck is Mount Brydges anyway?" The truth is, we are on the map because ice runs in our veins; it's part of our community, our culture, and our hearts.

I watched my brother play as a Bulldog about 25 years ago, and his jersey still hangs in the Dog House. I was honoured to be a guest speaker at the 2019 Commemorative Night held at the Tri-Township Arena in honour of our "ice angels", an event that showcased just how dedicated our community is to the game, and the people that play it. I was also fortunate enough to be on the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) for Strathroy-Caradoc's Hometown Hockey and I think it's very safe to say that this area absolutely loves the game! Some might even call it a healthy obsession!!

As you've already seen, our small community has a very strong voice and we will fight this to protect our arena, our HUB, our wellbeing. We understand that the facility needs work, but it's well worth the investment. Your MBDAA, Jr. C, Magic Blades, Moms & tots, mens leagues, etc. will thank you! For many years to come!!







Good Afternoon,

I hope this email finds you well.

I wanted to share my thoughts regarding the Nustadia Report that was released on Thursday.

I wanted to preface that, I understand that assessment and reports are not the fault of the Council members.

The outcomes of this decision effects this community a great deal and needs to be considered.

My. Brydges has seen exponential growth over the passes 5 years, the last 2 years in particular. However we have not seen growth in amenities or programs that auppprt such a population increase. That in mind, I find that utilizing information from greater than 2 years ago for this assessment quite alarming and it is easily to conclude that the assessment is not relevant anymore.

I would also like to state that recreational hubs such as those included in the report are more suited to a city centre rather than a wide spread municipality.

Years ago the residents from My. Brydges, Komoka, Delaware, Muncey, Oneida, Chippewa and Melbourne came together to fundraise themselves for an arena for their community. I know this because our family participated in this at the time. This was to provide the on ice activities to their community in close proximity. There were reports of issues with availability for fair distribution of ice.

The arena also has always brought in customers for the local businesses from those coming into town.

As long as I can remember this town has been centred around this arena. It provides a place for youth to come together and compete or participate in sport or activities to be active. It also has provided adults younger and more senior a place to play as well. Sunday morning hockey has been running here for many years and is so popular that there is a waiting list.

There are many associations such as MB Skating Club, MB Cougars, CMO minor hockey, Sunday morning adult hockey, MB Bulldogs, the list continues. I have been scheduling ice for sometime in this area and I have to say with certainty that there will not be enough ice available in this plan for all of these associations to continue to provide

programming. There is simply not enough ice for this growing population.

But they won't have the opportunity to do so if you decommission their arena.

The community will be negatively effected by having no arena within Mt. Brydges.

Please consider the future for all of the communities the arena serves and either complete the necessary upgrades to the existing arena or build a new one within Mt. Brydges.

This is an opportunity to properly serve the community of Mt. Brydges and Melbourne as a part of Caradoc. Our family would not support the council in any decommission plans.



Dear Mayor,

We have been residents of Caradoc and Strathroy-Caradoc for 47 years. First of all on a farm and then as retirees in the Wood Edge community of Mount Brydges. The Mount Brydges arena has been the focal point of recreational activity for the village since it was built in 1973. The arena and Community Centre (1991) are surrounded by Mount Brydges Lions Club park which is a gem for Mount Brydges.

Yes, the current arena is in need of such repair that alternative ideas for the building have to be considered. You can only repair a building for so long before it needs to be replaced. With that in mind a new multi-use building should be considered for this site.

Each community would like to have an arena on their wish list as hockey and figure skating is what we do, in the winter, in Canada. We also have to think outside the box. At the top of the list, of wishes by the 555 residents, is an indoor pool followed by a walking track. In all of Strathroy-Caradoc there is no indoor pool. It would make sense to include an indoor pool in a new facility that could service all Strathroy-Caradoc and make Mount Brydges a destination for an innovative centre. Learning to swim is a life skill and swimming is one of the best forms of exercise. This facility could also include a walking track, one ice pad, meeting rooms and court space.

We did read the report and saw the examples for pavilion and dome use. It is an interesting scenario. The one issue with a dome is that it gets to look very dirty and weathered in a short period of time. We hate to say it, since we were donors to the building of the Community Centre, but it should also be torn down to build this new multi-use facility with the above listed items. Our sleepy village is growing by leaps and bounds and we would like to have something unique to draw from all of Strathroy Caradoc.

Thanks for this, I would not have gone through this if you hadn't sent it.

I have a number of concerns and questions:

In regards to the survey responses, the total responses (both full and partial) represent about 4% of the population (assuming a population of 23,000). This seems like a low percentage to me, and I wonder if this is a result of only making the survey available online.

I think we could have done a better job of publiciting the survey and getting it into more

I think we could have done a better job of publicizing the survey and getting it into more hands. I am still a big believer in putting paper documents in people's hands.

I don't think we should be making decisions based on the wants of 4% of the population

I have not seen the report by WalterFedy Engineering Consultants on the condition of the facilities, and I don't doubt that repairs and upgrades are required to the facilities. I would question however how many of the upgrades are required and how many would be

Even assuming that all the upgrades are required, if I read the information correctly, the total projected capital repairs over the next 15 years are about 16.9 M\$, or about 1.1M\$ per year. I don't see how this justifies spending over 40 M\$ for new facilities (The interest costs alone on 40 M\$ would cover the costs of the capital work on the existing facilities).

I don't see in the report any mention of the costs to decommission the existing buildings. Has this been taken into account?

The cost to demolish these buildings are not inconsequential, and if any asbestos is present, the costs rise significantly (Do we have asbestos reports on these buildings?)

While some of the demolition costs would be offset by the value of scrap metal, crushed concrete, etc, these values will not come close to covering the costs of the demolition and remediation of the sites.

How would we expect to pay for the costs of all this work?

At a 38.2 M\$ cost, this works out to about \$1660 per resident (assuming a population of 23000).

If the average household has 3 people, this is \$5000 per household. This does not include any interest costs to borrow the money for the work.

Certainly nothing should proceed until financing has been secured.

Would the proposed outdoor ice pad in Mount Brydges be refrigerated? If not I don't see this getting much use.

Do we really need an artificial turf field? An air inflated dome for an indoor playing field? What about the additional operating costs of the new facilities, including additional maintenance, staffing, utilities etc.? Have these been fully detailed?

And finally, how good are the estimated costs of the new facilities?

I spent my life professional as a Project Manager in Sarnia, and I would guess these are what we would have called ballpark estimates.

Given the changes that would come as the project is developed, and issues that arise, my guess is these costs could easily increase by 20 to 30%,

Likely closer to 50 M\$ than the 40 M\$ estimate, in my opinion

This is a major undertaking for the municipality and considerable thought needs to be put into this before anything proceeds.

Lets keep in mind that the population here is only about 23000 people.

Good morning,

I apologize for the intrusion but felt it appropriate to reach out to you to offer the opportunity to provide feedback in regards to a consequential discussion that is upcoming at Strathroy-Caradoc Council starting on May 12th. Over the course of my term on council, our paths will have crossed in that you will have reached out to me in regards to an issue or concern or to share comments. Normally I speak when spoken to but given the importance of the subject matter, I hope that you will see it as reasonable for me to reach out today. I have never done this before. I have reviewed previous outlook contacts from past council interactions with me to identify relevant emails as best I can. Ultimately, I am just trying to provide you with publicly available information as a resident and taxpayer should you wish to provide any input or feedback or may not be aware. If you have already responded, please ignore. Or perhaps you do not have an opinion, which is fine too. In a world in which criticism is often a default, I am hopeful that I won't be criticized for this approach..."I got an email from a councillor...I didn't get an email from a councillor" and wear it in some negative fashion. I am just trying another approach to get the word out but more importantly encourage feedback.

I have spent the better part of the last 48 hours responding to residents in regards to the Recreational Facilities Renewal report released on Thursday afternoon from Nustadia. The link is provided here... Nustadia Report and Recommendations. Accompanying this report is the following report from municipal staff Staff Report to Council - Recreation Infrastructure Renewal Strategy. It is important to note that this report has not been received at council nor have its conclusions been evaluated or endorsed. No decisions have been made. These are consultant's recommendations only. Council had previously commissioned a facilities assessment some time ago in response to our aging infrastructure and to better

understand future challenges and liabilities. It was deemed a prerequisite for any further discussion in formulating future recreation plans. Council contracted Nustadia (reputable firm commonly engaged for this type of study) to perform a community consultation process and evaluation with the intent that it would lead to recommendations on future amenities.

As a result of the review, the above consultant's report was released this past week. It suggests the establishment of community hubs for recreation in both Mount Brydges and Strathroy totalling upwards of \$38m in investment potential. The report claims that it represents a co-ordinated renewal strategy that positions the Municipality to respond to current and future needs of residents. It follows a public consultation with residents and sports/community user groups, including a public survey that saw the highest response rate of any online survey offered by the municipality to date (550+). Whether that is sufficient remains to be seen. The responses appear to identify a demand for a greater variety of local recreation facilities and programs, in a fiscally responsible way. At least that was the conclusion raised. Perhaps you participated in the survey and if you did I would be interested to know if you felt that the questions were geared towards a wish list for future additions or an "either/or" perspective. Whether I agree with the conclusions will be investigated and expanded upon through questioning, as a number of concerns have been identified.

As I have been responding to people, I encourage them to read through the report in its entirety to understand the rationale for their recommendations and to forward any questions or concerns or alternatively support for items within it. Council members will have many questions of their own to ask and may challenge some of the conclusions/recommendations based on additional community feedback. So, any future outcomes are not at this point determined and it is simply recommendations for consideration.

Particularly concerning to Ward 2 residents and receiving a strong negative response from most who have already reached out to me directly is the recommendation to decommission the TriTownship arena and to not replace it but rather place other recreational amenities in Mt Brydges. For the record, it is not my preference to see Mt Brydges without a functional indoor ice pad as recommended in the report. Although perhaps you feel differently, which is fine. I need to hear that too. At this stage, Council is tasked with listening, collecting information/feedback, doing their homework, and formulating questions to consider for a meeting to be held next week specifically relating to this report and next steps. I have asked that people communicate with us formally (not just ranting on social media) and I am saving and documenting each interaction, questions, and commentary. I encourage you to reach out to all of council should you choose to comment.

The end goal is to determine how best for the community to proceed within a responsible financial framework, with an eye towards servicing a variety of ages from seniors to youth programming and to provide a variety of amenities. This is a difficult and expensive process. There will be a variety of wants and reactions to whatever is decided and I get to hear from a lot of different perspectives and opinions, many of them with passion, some with unnecessary aggression. I do live here and I do lose sleep over these things. In other words I care too.

So, while out of character to reach out in this fashion (I really hope it is appropriate), I do request that should you have an opinion on the report or any of its recommendations, that

you reach out to us with your feedback as you have in the past for other issues. Your ward 2 councillors (Sandi, Larry and I) are always available for other discussions too and you are welcomed to drop us a line or give us a call. I hope everyone is doing well and staying safe.

To All Strathroy-Caradoc Council:

I am very concerned with the direction that Nustadia Recreation Inc. is recommending in their report to Council regarding suggested actions to be taken on the Tri-Township arena in Mt. Brydges and the West Memorial Centre in Strathroy. As a long-time resident of Mount Brydges, my focus is on future recreational facilities for our growing village. In particular, I quote the following from your Council report of May 12, 2021 – CS-2021-06...

Community Wellbeing – Residents of all ages in Strathroy-Caradoc will have access to community amenities and activities that are accessible and support active lifestyles and wellbeing.

I will begin with some information on the growth of Mt. Brydges in the past ten years. Numbers given are from Statscan's census reports of 2011 and 2016.

- In 2011, Mt. Brydges had 1834 residents as reported in that year's census.
- In 2016, Mt. Brydges had 1842 residents as per the 2016 census. These residents lived in 680 residential dwellings of which 610 were detached homes. Average occupants per dwelling was 2.7 persons.
- The 2021 census is currently underway and figures will no be available until 2022 or later.

Since the 2016 census, the population growth and homebuilding in Mt. Brydges have seen unprecedented growth and there seems to be no slowing down. According to my information, the following subdivisions have been approved...

1.	Woods Edge Subdivision	270 homes
2.	South Creek Subdivision	214 homes
3.	Edgewood Subdivision, Phase 1	82 homes
4.	Condos at Community Centre	70 homes
5.	Lions Gate Subdivision	68 homes
6.	Behind Auto Spa off Adelaide Road	38 homes
7.	Area north of Glendon and west of Queen St.	61 homes
Subtot	al	803 homes

If we use the average occupants per household number from the 2016 census (2.7), this will add 2168 residents to our population since 2016, a 117 percentage increase in population, or well over double our 2016 population.

Also, the following are under consideration at this time....

- Phase 2 of Edgewood Subdivision estimated 100 homes
- Sifton development at corner of Parkhouse Drive and Rougham Rd estimated 200 homes
- Land area north of village bound by Falconbridge, Rougham and Adelaide Road estimated 200 homes

Using the same number of occupants per household (2.7), this will add a further 1350 residents to our village. I estimate that the total population in Mt. Brydges by the year 2031 will be over 5,300.

I return to the following....

Community Wellbeing – Residents of all ages in Strathroy-Caradoc will have access to community amenities and activities that are accessible and support active lifestyles and wellbeing.

How does it make sense then to cut back on community amenities when you see that the community is growing at unprecedented rates in housing and population. Surely you can foresee that we need to expand our amenities, not shrink them. Isn't the better solution to build a new arena/community centre over the next few years while keeping the current one operational while controlling costs? What good will it be for community of our size to have no ice pad for use by various sport programs? How many parents are going to sit outdoors to watch their child play a hockey game? Or how many parents will sit outdoors to watch their child practise or compete in figure skating. We will be the laughing stock of the area for sure when outsiders attend competitive events.

Regarding an indoor sporting field that is half the size of regulation fields, what use will it have. No one will rent it for their teams as it makes no sense unless it is of regulation size.

The answer is NOT for us to drive to Strathroy or Komoka. Our growing community should have its own proper-sized facilities to serve its residents and their families. After all, with 804 (and growing) new property taxes coming into SC coffers, the money should be spent here and not in other communities. It seems to be a trend where the town of Strathroy gets more and Mt. Brydges is an afterthought.

Nustadia Recreation Inc.'s recommendation should be set aside as it is not looking at the future of this community. So much has changed in the past five years and will continue to change for the next five years. Their plan does not seem to have a horizon other than to consolidate and control costs. That is not always the right answer.

Subject: Recreation Proposal

Good Morning Councilors and Mayor,

I would like to take the opportunity to write about the proposed recreation plan for the municipality. I am so very disappointed to read the majority of the proposal that has been put forward and extremely underwhelmed. It is like we asked an outsider to make a suggestion box based on some random survey that went out with the hopes no one answered it, this proposal lacks qualitative evidence. This takes no talent or foresight to recognize the impact such proposal would have on the community and lacks forward planning of community growth and investment in one of main social determinants of health of our young people. I answered the survey as a community member and not once did I acknowledge the need for less sports facilities nor did the questions measure my level of need for a service such as the two arenas slated for closure. It asked me if they were clean and maintained and this is the reason to close a facility rather the lack of management by this council to properly employ custodians of such kind of like our new roads dept. plan, now that one is solid we never get 8 cm of snow in town so unlikely we need a roads department at all and I didn't see a survey for that I just got told to buy a 4 wheel drive because I live in the country. I have worked in social work for a many years this survey did not measure anything to be honest, would I like to see outdoor trails and sports such as pickle ball absolutely but at what cost. I was born and raised in this region, my kids both active in sports from school sports to figure skating and hockey. My son gave up hockey when he was aged 12 and switched to figure skating because of lack of ice in Mount Brydges. He would be getting up at 6 am on a Saturday so he could be shuttled to Glencoe to get ice to practice on. What kid wants to remain in a sport that requires you to give up sleep so you can practice at that hour on a Saturday only to drive out of town to play a game more often than not he would sleep to and from the rink and to the game. Eventually my son decided figure skating looked more reasonable. He had a very distinguished skating career which led him across this country and he eventually moved to Montreal to continue in the sport he loved because the sports in Quebec are better funded and by far more accessible based on available facilities. The current skating clubs in both Strathroy and Mount Brydges struggle for membership because of lack of ice time that can suit active families as hockey takes precedence in this community. The concept that you need 2 less pads of ice lacks direction for the future of these growing communities, I would counter that with good leadership we would plan for the future and not make the same mistake we made with the public pool and thinking about today vs where we might be in 10 years. Kids who are

fully involved in sports and activities in their youth are better community members more socially involved and more likely to return to the community as adults to rear their families.

I am fortunate to live near the boundary of Middlesex Centre and have watched as this welldeveloped plan for growth has been supported by the infrastructure investments it made early on. From the rink in Komoka that implemented solar to the long term plans that include multiple walking trails, outdoor rinks and basketball courts, multiuse fitness facilities to outdoor activities that centred around the hub of the community market this community has done some solid preplanning for growth. Put a roof on the pool make the memorial rink a place to be focus on building walking trails people can bike on from one community to another and link the two towns that feel so separate. Mount Brydges has always taken a back seat to Strathroy based on tax dollars and power privilege dynamics that has been exploited by the bigger community and these proposals reinforce the that inequity loud and clear. As a tax payer I will take interest in the development of the future of this little community as I believe it will determine if my tax dollars remain in this community or I decide to move elsewhere likely across the town line to a community that thinks about the future and not waits to see what happens that is what good leadership looks like; fairness, equality and access for all the community members not just the north end of Strathroy. It would be nice to see representation on council that advocates for this community and its arena instead of throwing projects as an afterthought because the majority of council lives in Strathroy. Maybe next election based on population this should be a consideration to ensure a voice with the next council. I thank you in advance and look forward to what comes of these projects hoping that the three pillars of any good community is fairness, equality and access for all and encourages the next generation and the previous generations to live a healthy lifestyle that promotes longevity and makes Strathroy Caradoc a community that is thought of highly by those seeking a place to be.

To All Strathroy-Caradoc Council:

I am very concerned with the direction that Nustadia Recreation Inc. is recommending in their report to Council regarding suggested actions to be taken on the Tri-Township arena in Mt. Brydges and the West Memorial Centre in Strathroy. As a long-time resident of Mount Brydges, my focus is on future recreational facilities for our growing village. In particular, I quote the following from your Council report of May 12, 2021 – CS-2021-06...

Community Wellbeing – Residents of all ages in Strathroy-Caradoc will have access to community amenities and activities that are accessible and support active lifestyles and wellbeing.

I will begin with some information on the growth of Mt. Brydges in the past ten years. Numbers given are from Statscan's census reports of 2011 and 2016.

- In 2011, Mt. Brydges had 1834 residents as reported in that year's census.
- In 2016, Mt. Brydges had 1842 residents as per the 2016 census. These residents lived in 680 residential dwellings of which 610 were detached homes. Average occupants per dwelling was 2.7 persons.
- The 2021 census is currently underway and figures will no be available until 2022 or later.

Since the 2016 census, the population growth and homebuilding in Mt. Brydges have seen unprecedented growth and there seems to be no slowing down. According to my information, the following subdivisions have been approved...

1.	Woods Edge Subdivision	270 homes
2.	South Creek Subdivision	214 homes
3.	Edgewood Subdivision, Phase 1	82 homes
4.	Condos at Community Centre	70 homes
5.	Lions Gate Subdivision	68 homes
6.	Behind Auto Spa off Adelaide Road	38 homes
7.	Area north of Glendon and west of Queen St.	61 homes
Subtotal		803 homes

If we use the average occupants per household number from the 2016 census (2.7), this will add 2168 residents to our population since 2016, a 117 percentage increase in population, or well over double our 2016 population.

Also, the following are under consideration at this time....

- Phase 2 of Edgewood Subdivision estimated 100 homes
- Sifton development at corner of Parkhouse Drive and Rougham Rd estimated 200 homes
- Land area north of village bound by Falconbridge, Rougham and Adelaide Road estimated 200 homes

Using the same number of occupants per household (2.7), this will add a further 1350 residents to our village. I estimate that the total population in Mt. Brydges by the year 2031 will be over 5,300.

I return to the following....

Community Wellbeing – Residents of all ages in Strathroy-Caradoc will have access to community amenities and activities that are accessible and support active lifestyles and wellbeing.

How does it make sense then to cut back on community amenities when you see that the community is growing at unprecedented rates in housing and population. Surely you can foresee that we need to expand our amenities, not shrink them. Isn't the better solution to build a new arena/community centre over the next few years while keeping the current one operational while controlling costs? What good will it be for community of our size to have no ice pad for use by various sport programs? How many parents are going to sit outdoors to watch their child play a hockey game? Or how many parents will sit outdoors to watch their child practise or compete in figure skating. We will be the laughing stock of the area for sure when outsiders attend competitive events.

Regarding an indoor sporting field that is half the size of regulation fields, what use will it have. No one will rent it for their teams as it makes no sense unless it is of regulation size.

The answer is NOT for us to drive to Strathroy or Komoka. Our growing community should have its own proper-sized facilities to serve its residents and their families. After all, with 804 (and growing) new property taxes coming into SC coffers, the money should be spent here and not in other communities. It seems to be a trend where the town of Strathroy gets more and Mt. Brydges is an afterthought.

Nustadia Recreation Inc.'s recommendation should be set aside as it is not looking at the future of this community. So much has changed in the past five years and will continue to change for the next five years. Their plan does not seem to have a horizon other than to consolidate and control costs. That is not always the right answer.

Dear Mayor and Councillors

I have been a board member of the Tri-Township arena for a bit more than a decade and find myself currently in the role of Chair for this board of Directors, appointed by council to represent the municipality. This is my second time as chairman of this board, a duty that I accept with honour and a great deal of pride. As you know, the facility is currently managed by this Board as it remains a partnership between Strathroy-Caradoc and the Chippewas of the Thames First Nation.

I am also a past member of the CDAC committee in Strathroy-Caradoc and learned a great deal about the passion that residents have for their community while serving on that board.

I have had an opportunity to read the draft report which makes specific recommendations regarding the Tri-Township Arena and other facilities in Strathroy-Caradoc and would like to provide you with some specific feedback and thoughts.

I would like to compliment council on its forethought and professionalism in commissioning a study such as this to determine our community's needs. I believe that such a study can be useful in determining the current state of affairs, and can be a useful tool in guiding councillors towards an overall strategy that meets the needs of its citizens. I would caution that such tools only tell part of the story, and can often mislead the reader in assessing the subject's overall impact on the communities about which they are written.

Small towns in Ontario build specific identities around the facilities that operate within them. Some small towns have baseball diamonds, some have soccer pitches, and some have arenas. Mt. Brydges currently has a long history and has built its culture and identity around the game of hockey and the centralized arena facility. The arena hosts weekly in-season hockey games for youth in two different age demographics, dances, and fundraising events, concerts, and summer and winter recreational sports.

I understand the costs of operating these facilities, as I and our Board review our financial statements, and compare them to those in other facilities across Ontario. I like the approach that this report takes in recommending a multi-use facility for Mt. Brydges. In my opinion, this approach is long overdue.

This plan would not be complete if it does not include at least a single regulation pad ice facility.

As the report indicates, there are many ways to build a facility inclusive of green technologies, heat recovery systems, and co-located ancillary facilities such as a community centre and other commercial enterprises that augment recreational facilities. The arena, Soccer fields, and Baseball diamonds are a staple in the community and provide an opportunity for recreational tourism by bringing people to a small community to attend an event at such facilities. Co-locating these facilities in one large facility would decrease the opportunities for teams and citizens to visit Mt. Brydges. Strathroy would obviously benefit, at the expense of Mt. Brydges.

I have lived in the Mt. Brydges community for over 15 years and can recall attending hockey, public skating, dances, roller skating, and other recreational events well into my youth. I learned to skate as an elementary school student in the Tri-Township arena, a use that continues by the Thames Valley School Board today. Hockey and skating are woven into Canadians' identities, and we almost always begin our love affair with this sport at an early age, in local arenas. Hockey, skating and Mt. Brydges have become intertwined. Mt. Brydges has produced some excellent professional hockey players who represent our community with pride. Mt. Brydges residents have become accustomed to the level of service we currently have within our community. Taking our arena away would create a sense of division for our two wards, this at a time when there is development and growth happening within Mt. Brydges. Further, I fear a sense of alienation between ourselves and our excellent community partners, the Chippewa of the Thames First Nation.

In the interest of better serving your constituents, I implore you to consider including a single pad arena for Mt. Brydges in your plans and that you consider closing the West Middlesex facility, achieving the goals of the report reducing the municipality's ice pads from four to three. Continuing on with a pad in Mt. Brydges better serves the municipality's citizens, youth, and seniors who live outside of the Strathroy town limits, and demonstrates your careful attention to the wellbeing of the residents of Mt. Brydges and surrounding communities.

While I agree with the overall philosophy behind closing aging and unserviceable facilities, I am concerned about other aspects of the proposal. For example, I do not believe that an inflatable building offers a practical long-term solution from an operating cost and maintenance perspective. I am concerned that the survey was only posted on the municipality's website for a two-week period, and during that time, only about 2.5% of people in the municipality provided feedback. As the recreation plan is a five-year plan, could more time not be afforded to capture the opinions of residents? I am concerned about the validity of the data with such a low rate of response.

Hello,

I am extremely saddened by what seemed to me as a casual announcement of a plan to close two local arenas.

My family members use all three of the local Arenas in Mount Brydges and Strathroy. We live in Mount Brydges, we are members of the Mount Brydges Skating Club and Magic Blades Synchro Teams. My husband plays on Men's league hockey teams, I have been taking my kids to weekly parent and tot skates for the last 6 years. We love the arenas and spend a great deal of our time at them. Ice time is very hard to get at all three of the Arenas.

I filled out the survey accordingly. So I am one of 500 people who actually filled out that survey. But I have been talking to a lot of neighbors and friends who knew nothing about the survey. And it's pretty sad to create a plan based on only 500 people when the population of Strathroy is 23,000.

I am also hearing that the Mount Brydges Skating club wasn't even aware of the survey or asked any questions to help assist with this plan. Which has false statements saying that the Skating Club rents ice in Komoka, they do not.

The arena is part of our community. It's where our kids learn not only skills of sport but life skills. We want Mount Brydges to have an Arena. Yes it needs repairs, but it needs to stay here. Dear councillors,

I am writing this letter to address my thoughts on the proposal that the Nustadia Recreation consultant agency is putting forth regarding the tri-township arena in Mount Brydges. As a lifelong resident of Mt. Brydges, I have seen what the arena means to the residents of the community and how important it is to the small-town atmosphere that Mt. Brydges is known for. While I did not participate in hockey or figure skating as a child, the tri-township arena was my very first employer, as I know it was for many of my peers. Whether it was playing music for the skating club, keeping score for hockey, or working at the snack bar, the arena has helped many young people get their start as working members of the community. For 4 years, I spent 12 hours each week sitting in the announcer's booth and watching as skaters learned new skills and developed as athletes. I have also seen the friendships that bloom on and off the ice.

I do understand that the arena itself needs updating, but I don't believe the solution is to tear it down and rebuild it in Strathroy. Mt. Brydges is a small town with very few amenities for families to access on foot. For programs that run right after school, many parents can have their children walk to the arena and can meet up with them later, meaning less time that they have to take off of work to run their kids to and from practice. If the only accessible rinks are in either Strathroy or Komoka, there will likely be a decline in the number of kids in the community that are enrolled in sports because parents will simply not have the time to take them where they need to go. I know that there is a big push to have children becoming more active in this increasingly technology-based society and taking away opportunities for children to be involved in sport seems counter-productive. I also understand that it is only a 20minute drive to Strathroy from Mt. Brydges, however many skaters they to the arena anywhere from 2-4 days each week, meaning that families will be spending anywhere from 80 to 160 minutes (1.5-2.5 hours) driving each week. There are also those that come from Melbourne to use the tri-township arena, meaning they will be spending even more time driving, which is both bad for the environment and costing families an unnecessary amount of money on gas.

It is not only children that benefit from having an arena in the community as there are many adults who are a part of local leagues. There are the adult synchronized skating teams, the men's hockey leagues, and the Mt. Brydges Bulldogs, whose games bring out the support of the community. These are just a few of the groups that are constantly jockeying for ice time, enough so that there are many groups who have to schedule time in the Komoka and Strathroy facilities already. Taking out two indoor ice pads in the community and only replacing one of them will increase the number of groups that are fighting for ice time, and again there will likely be a decrease in the amount of people who are participating in sports in the community.

I understand that there was a survey that was sent out a couple of years ago, however from those that I have talked to, the questions were very ambiguous. Many who answered the survey did not realize that when they said yes that the facility needs an update, or that it is in need of repairs, they were then telling those that conducted the survey that they were in favour of taking out the facility all together. If an option had been included in the survey that differentiated between replacing the facility or getting rid of it, I think the data would look very different.

As I mentioned earlier, Mt. Brydges is a small community with few amenities, and thus there are few places for the community to gather and connect. The arena has become such a place both out of necessity and because of a love of the sports that are housed within it. For many of the teams and clubs that play out of the arena, their identity lies with the fact that they are from Mt. Brydges, and they have been able to accomplish amazing things because of the community they come from. I fear that the sense of pride of being from Mt. Brydges might start to diminish if the arena is moved to Strathroy as proposed, and we will begin to lose the connection to each other that the arena has helped to support.

I apologize for the long email; however, I feel that these are points that needed to be made. I hope you will take what I have said into consideration when discussing the community and making decisions that affect all residents of this township.

Hello,

I wanted to email today to voice my concerns regarding the proposal of eliminating Tri-Township Arena and WMMA.

All three of my children are in programs at one of these facilities. My two daughters skate singles and participate on the Synchro Teams and my son plays hockey for the Rockets.

My concern is that most organizational groups have a very hard time getting ice booked as it is, if you eliminate 2 of our 4 ice pads even with adding an outdoor pavilion rink, how are you going to accommodate all the user groups?

The survey conducted was filled out by ONLY 555 residents which equates to maybe 2% of the population. This is not what the general population is feeling right now as per the petition that is currently being signed. Plus the survey was very misleading, asking questions about what we would like to see in the community but no mention of what may be taken away. I agree that we need more rec facilities to accommodate our growing community but not at the expense of removing two arenas and not replacing them-if anything we need more ice pads, not less. I would also ask that as council you come up with a more effective way to reach your residents then a survey that was posted online only 4 times in the month of October 2020 during a pandemic. My understanding from the results of that survey report was that MBSC and Magic Blades rent ice in Komoka, which is not true (minus the one adult team that couldn't obtain ice at either center so had to travel to komoka for ice). We have never skated in Komoka.

More importantly, Arenas bring such a sense of community to each individual town, with Mt. Brydges consistently growing in population, where will the sense of community be? How are you going to foster a community approach? My children need to feel a sense of community now more than ever while living through a pandemic. Their whole world has been turned upside down and now you want to take away their love of skating and hockey as well. Their mental health and well-being is top concern for our family and when we are able to return to the arena, we know it will bring them a sense of security and peace.

I feel as though we were blindsided as a club and myself as a resident of the Strathroy-Caradoc community, with no warning and not consulted on what our thoughts were.

I am a resident of Mount Brydges and have two children who have for the last two years spent a lot of time in Tri County Arena in Mount Brydges, both learning to skate at Can Skate and playing for Mount Brydges Cougars. Pre-pandemic, when it was available, we participated in family skates every weekend which helped our kids learn to skate. During the Pandemic, we rented the ice a handful of times for our 'bubble' to use when possible. I know of many other local households whose lives seemed to revolve around that arena. It is a community hub and place to gather. My husband grew up in Mount Brydges using that arena as well. Essentially, it means a lot to us.

The local population is exploding with families and we would expect to increase, if not at least maintain, the amenities that we already have. The fact that the report seems to think that having us travel to the Gemini complex, which is a 20 minute drive (or 15 using the highway) is a reasonable alternative is completely <u>un</u>reasonable. Furthermore, the fact that the council and staff working at Strathroy Caradoc seems to agree and has brought the proposals forward seems to indicate a complete lack of understanding of the community needs of Mount Brydges. Just to be clear, amenities being added in Strathroy are NOT considered amenities for Mount Brydges. We can drive into London in the same time period. So although certain niche amenities in Strathroy can be nice when needed, there are certain flagship community services that are expected to exist <u>within</u> Mount Brydges, and a community arena is one.

The Draft report by Nustadia reads as a very rudimentary business case using information that is out of date and lacking in any true local understanding. The accompanying staff report refers to some estimates made from a couple of Municipality staff and a Survey with a very low response rate. I was one of the people who did fill out the survey, and although it did ask about the condition of the arena it in no way should have been considered a barometer as to whether we supported the arena being decommissioned. This survey was also executed during COVID when residents are exhausted, highly stressed and barely using any recreational facilities. Generic surveys about "what people think" never elicit a passionate response or a material response rate, and frankly you should have known better. Obviously everyone who uses the arena knows it is old and needs to be updated. What's the point of even asking those questions? Is it because you knew that whatever responses you received would support these plans? If there was a more specifically targeted survey that was titled: The arena needs replacing, what do you want us to do? And then listed all of the possible options, I'm sure there would be a huge response rate that would provide a lot more usable information. As a finance professional who analyzes numbers and data as my occupation, seeing such big decisions made using such inadequate information feels so wrong. We can do better than this!

Similar to the affordable housing debacle, as the Counselors representing Mount Brydges residents you <u>must have known</u> that this plan would be incredibly upsetting to many residents of this town. The way these proposals are being presented (as an all or nothing decision) seem to indicate that you <u>don't even care</u>. Which is the big head scratcher because I am certain that you do care. Therefore, I would ask that you please be much more strategic, respectful and thoughtful about how you execute the proposals of some of these big changes.

In the least, the time and care should be taken to come up with alternative plans that are feasible, that the community can comment on. As an example at the beginning of the affordable housing proposal, if council had put forward all potential options that existed (i.e. the land at the park, the land in front of the arena, and any other parcels of land that could potentially be used). All of these options could have come with the pros and cons list, discussed and debated, and then a final solution agreed upon. That feels much more transparent and respectful to the community, and would save the time of going all the way down one path, only to have to start from scratch at a late stage in the process. That is also how the TVDSB school boundary assessment process happened, when a decision needed to be made about how to address the capacity issues at Parkview in Komoka (for some reason Caradoc was brought into one of the options and I was a participant on the committee). A number of alternatives were presented in a report by consultants, then community groups from all schools included could put forward their thoughts, and a final decision was reached. There will always be winners and losers but at least it felt like there was transparency and lots of opportunity for community input along the way, not just at the very end. This process will likely be undertaken again in the near future relating to Caradoc P.S. capacity issues.

So relating to this arena issue, the most respectful way to undertake this process would be to come up with alternatives that are all within the budget constraints and in line with the strategic vision of the area. Then the opportunity for community feedback should be presented to determine which alternatives should be further examined. Also, reports being presented should use more up to date and use more localized data. The TVDSB boundary assessment used more recent population and demographic info, and was also able to forecast that data into the future using the information available (i.e. subdivisions being built etc). Why can't this process use that same type of information? This report comes across as lazy and generic.

I also understand that a challenge is the fact that while Mount Brydges is in Strathroy Caradoc, much of our recreational needs and usage exists within the "Del-Ko-Brydge" region, which also includes a different municipality. But that said, even though the taxes to support the capital investment may only come from Strathroy Caradoc, the operational revenues come from the DelKoBrydges region (i.e. many hockey users from

Komoka/Kilworth) to help support the facility. The fact of the matter is, there have probably been lots of business growth opportunities for the arena that have not been taken advantage of in the past, both due to the state of the facility and other management related issues. With a new facility, there should certainly be more opportunities in the future to leverage business opportunities to grow revenues and support the facility operations.

I know that an argument is that if we are all so passionate about this, then why are not enough people volunteering? Well I would indeed like to volunteer my time and had tried to sign up, but other Board Commitments at the time were in my way of attending some of the required meetings. I have since stepped down from those commitments and would be happy to help moving forward in any way I can. Also, it would probably be prudent to have some kind of sub-committee that looks ONLY at Mt. Brydges and how all of the pieces of each part of the strategic plan fit together in the scope of just our small town. Although part of Strathroy Caradoc, Mount Brydges maintains its own unique identity and is growing like crazy. As you probably know by the endless social media discussions, there are a lot of growing pains happening in town and there needs to be a strategic plan just for us to identify the needs that need to be met within the perimeter of our town vs. the greater Municipality.

I know this email was long but it is really just a reflection of the passion felt within this community, and also the great frustration towards recent big decisions that don't seem to have the proper due process in place to garner the community's trust. At this point, there is hopefully still time to do this the right way.

Strathroy-Caradoc Councillors,

I understand that change needs to happen for growth in the future. The report from Nustadia reflects information gathered from 2016 onward. With the recent growth in the Mt. Brydges area, does this report take that into consideration? The amount of people now residing in the area has increased and the result is that younger families are now residing here. This coupled with the areas surrounding Mt. Brydges - Delaware, Komoka and Kilworth - have added more families that would use this facility. I understand that they are not in Strathroy-Caradoc tax base but the families will still need a place to play hockey, learn to skate, figure skate or just family skate.

I have been involved in many aspects of the Tri-township arena dating back to my first days of playing with the Bulldogs back in 1986. I have been involved on the minor hockey board and watched my children grow in playing hockey there. I now volunteer for the OMHA. The Mt. Brydges minor hockey association has always had strong registration numbers and that is still the case to this year. We are one of the highest registrations in the OMHA area of Southwestern Ontario. To add to this, the Mt. Brydges skating club is one - if not the best - clubs in our area.

The report states that taking the arena out of Mt. Brydges is the best course of action and turning the Gemini sportsplex into a three pad arena. I find fault in that statement. The timeline in all of this is 2022 - close Mt. Brydges, 2022 to 2027 close West Middlesex, 2022 to 2027 - add to Gemini. I know now that many user groups from Mt. Brydges have to facilitate ice time at other arenas - Glencoe, Strathroy and Komoka just cover off their needs. To go from 5 arenas to 4 and still have a 5 year gap is not very friendly idea to anyone.

I guess the whole reason for my email today, is that I do not want Mt. Brydges to lose their identity here. Sometimes building the bigger arena is not the best idea. The three councillors that represent our area, all have had a relationship with the arena in one way or another and I am sure that nothing but positive thoughts come from that. Good Morning,

I write this email to all of you on a dreary Saturday morning while still in disbelief of the recommendation of Nustadia to decommission the Tri-Township Arena in Mt. Brydges and not replace it with a new facility.

The morning is dreary due to the weather and due to the fact that the minor hockey association in our town that is home to approximately 500 children aged 4 to 18 may be without our home arena.

Also disconcerting is the fact that the proposal identifies that the West Middlesex Arena is to be decommissioned, as well. However, the kids who skate in the Strathroy Minor Hockey Association will not be in the same situation as our players because their ice surface is to be replaced. The town of Strathroy will remain with three (3) ice surfaces and the town of Mt. Brydges will be left with zero (0).

I am a father of four (4) children who all play minor hockey in Mt. Brydges. I am a Hockey Canada Officiating Program (HCOP) Level IV official who skates minor hockey, senior hockey, and is retired from the OHA junior hockey that is home to the Rockets and Bulldogs. I am a volunteer that assists on the ice with several teams in Mt. Brydges. I am a volunteer that commits countless hours to be a Board of Executive member on the MBDAA as the ice conveyor for Mt. Brydges Minor Hockey. I choose to do all of these things in my 'spare' time away from my job as a service manager for an international fire protection company because of my love for the sport of hockey.

It saddens me (and all others involved) that the children that use the Tri-Township could potentially be left without a home arena. There are several minor hockey associations in the OMHA that are currently struggling to find children to fill their enrollment - this is not the case with Mt. Brydges. We have large residential expansions happening in my home town of Kilworth, in Komoka, in Delaware, and in Mt. Brydges. All of these towns send their children to play minor hockey at Tri-Township Arena. Due to our strong enrollment numbers of

approximately 500 children, we find ourselves in constant need for ice time for the various age groups and categories. In my role as ice convenor, I constantly find myself in a deficit situation with available ice time for all of our groups and have to find a compromise when scheduling the weekly ice allotment. We find ice time in other centres in order to keep our players skating and doing something that we all love. I would say to all of you that we are in need of a second ice surface for our minor hockey association - and have been for some time.


The season prior to covid (2019/20) saw an enrollment of 501 skaters. We have seen a 1.7% increase in enrollment over a ten (10) year period (see attached graph) - all prior to the large residential home expansions in our towns that I have previously mentioned. Therefore, it is very conceivable to consider that our association may grow to 545 players in 2025 and 593 in 2030 if the 1.7% increases were to continue. My question for all of you and the people at Nustadia would be - where do you intend to provide ice surfaces for these children to play hockey?

I am writing to you on behalf of the minor aged hockey players from our association that utilize Tri-Township arena. However, where is the consideration for the figure skating clubs that also call Tri-Township their home? Where is the consideration for the OHA Junior C Bulldogs that call Tri-Township home? Where is the consideration for the Sunday morning Gentlemen's League that call Tri-Township Arena home and have done so for decades? Where is the consideration for our oldtimers team (the Old Doggers) that call Tri-Township Arena home? Where is the consideration for the various other men's teams that also rent the ice and continue to stay and shape and see their long time ice hockey companions at Tri-Township Arena? Where are the considerations for all of the various men and women that utilize Tri-Township Arena to teach fundamentals of hockey, shooting, power skating etc. such as former Jr. B Rocket, NCAA standout, and former professional player Max Campbell?

I would like to use my voice on the behalf of all minor aged and age of majority individuals that use Tri-Township Arena, that love and call Tri-Township Arena home, to ask you to dismiss the recommendation of Nustadia. I would ask that you reconsider the decision to eliminate an indoor ice arena in Mt. Brydges. I would ask that you consider replacing Tri-Township Arena with a double pad indoor arena. At the very least, consider providing funding to extend the lifespan of the Tri-Township arena. The manager, Steve Dausett, and I have often discussed the fact that his arena does not lose anywhere near the amount of money that most community rinks in Ontario lose on an annual basis.

Please - for the love of all things hockey and figure skating - please dismiss the recommendations of Nustadia and come up with a new plan for an indoor arena in Mt. Brydges. After all, it is all of you that are elected officials who have vowed to act on behalf of the people in our town of Mt. Brydges. I feel that all of the children and adults deserve a place to play - especially with the world around us of late where so many things have been taken away from all of us.

It was in this arena that I learned how to skate, where I have fallen, yet learned to persevere by picking myself up and trying again. I have attended countless hockey practices and games; cheered on my siblings, cousins, friends, and now my children. I have felt the rush of the home team winning championships, and the heartbreak of defeat. I have attended fundraisers, skating carnivals, and concerts at this arena. This arena is not just a building, but the heart of a community that I can honestly say does not have much. I, along with many others, pay taxes in this town as well as registration fees to the MBDAA and Mount Brydges skating club. Some of these fees help towards the upkeep and maintenance of the arena. I understand it has surpassed its glory days, but perhaps our council could look into doing something to save it or replace it. We do not need an entire sports complex, but if you are willing to add a third pad to the Gemini, could that money be put

Community Services, Councillors and Mayor,

I'm writing to express deep concern over the recent release of the Municipality of Strathroy-Caradoc's Recreation Facility Infrastructure Renewal Plan, which sets out to decommission the Tri-Township Arena next year.

The information in the Council Report is stale-dated and doesn't consider the recent growth of this town, with the addition of substantial amounts of residential development, including South Creek, the ever-expanding Woods Edge, Lion's Gate, and the upcoming Garden Grove, Timberview Trail, as well as multi-unit dwellings and other big projects that are in the works. With more households and people, we need MORE access to recreational options, not LESS.

I've seen the proposals for recreational upgrades coming this year, including tennis and pickleball courts, and this is great, but the ARENA is the heart of our community. The Canada Community-Building Fund is just that, a "community building" fund; it's NOT an excuse to take away the very thing that brings our community together! Recreational infrastructure needs to reflect the wants and needs of the community, which filters through the community itself, not a round table of people looking at numbers! Community partnerships need to be considered too, like the Lions etc.

On a personal level, I took my kids skating at Moms & Tots every Thursday morning when they were preschoolers. My son went on to play with the Mt. Brydges Cougars and has a collection of OMHA medals from the many years he has played with MBDAA. My daughter grew up skating with the Magic Blades, who almost always made the podium, leaving people asking "where the heck is Mount Brydges anyway?" The truth is, we are on the map because ice runs in our veins;

it's part of our community, our culture, and our hearts.

I watched my brother play as a Bulldog about 25 years ago, and his jersey still hangs in the Dog House. I was honoured to be a guest speaker at the 2019 Commemorative Night held at the Tri-Township Arena in honour of our "ice angels", an event that showcased just how dedicated our community is to the game, and the people that play it. I was also fortunate enough to be on the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) for Strathroy-Caradoc's Hometown Hockey and I think it's very safe to say that this area absolutely loves the game! Some might even call it a healthy obsession!!

As you've already seen, our small community has a very strong voice and we will fight this to protect our arena, our HUB, our wellbeing. We understand that the facility needs work, but it's well worth the investment. Your MBDAA, Jr. C, Magic Blades, Moms & tots, mens leagues, etc. will thank you! For many years to come!!

Hi Sandi and Neil. You guys deserve a raise! This new announcement I suspect will bring way more discontent than any housing proposal ever did. I will keep it short for now and plan to attend the meeting on the 12th, but here are my concerns:

- -strathroy caradoc is proposing going from 4 arenas to 3, I am not aware of any stats that show a decline in local hockey or skating, my understanding is currently finding ice is an issue
- -the timelines they are proposing would mean there would be no Mt Brydges arena for the 2022-23 season but I am assuming there will not be anything added by then. So are they proposing cougars and skating no longer exist? Or just drive all over southwestern Ontario to find ice?
- -there's been an arena in Brydges as long as I've been alive. The demand is higher than ever, we are growing not shrinking. I understand Strathroy caradoc wants to be one community, but the reality is Gemini is 15 minutes plus away, upwards of 30 minutes away for some in caradoc. How is this accessible and attainable for families? And as strathroy caradoc seems to be focused on green initiatives, how is this healthy for the environment?

An outdoor rink is a lovely idea and I'm sure would be well used by recreational skaters but it does not replace an arena. I truly hope that this is not a done deal and that strathroy caradoc will reconsider or amend this plan. Of course a new arena is needed but this plan is not the solution.

I also have concerns about enough ice for strathroy caradoc youth hockey and the rockets that play out of west middlesex. The youth league is a great, inexpensive alternative for boys and girls.

Dear Councillor .

My name is Kevin Linker, and I am a 20-year-old who has grown up in Strathroy-Caradoc for my entire life and I proudly consider it my home. After reading the report that came out early today, I wanted to reach out to you and express both my concern and displeasure with the report and what it calls for. For years, it has been a known issue that not enough ice time has existed to serve the multiple different groups that call Strathroy-Caradoc their home. I have watched my sister and her teammates drive to Glencoe on a Friday night to play league games because the ice time was not available for them to play their home games in Strathroy. I am concerned that in this report, it calls for the decommissioning of both the Tri-Township Arena and West Middlesex Memorial Centre without a viable replacement for the valuable service these arenas provide.

The municipality of Strathroy-Caradoc has the privilege of being called "home" by two junior hockey teams, the Mount Brydges Bulldogs and the Strathroy Rockets as well as a new Senior "AA" hockey team in Strathroy that will begin play in the 2021-2022 season. Having played Junior B hockey for the Chatham Maroons last season and having the privilege to play against my hometown Rockets, I believe there is no way to possibly replicate the experience of playing in the West Middlesex Memorial Arena on a Saturday night. Both Junior facilities are considered top notch for the teams they exist for and to take these amenities away from both teams would be a travesty. As well, both arenas boast so much history and have been staples in the community for the longest time. The West Middlesex Memorial Centre was just renovated in 2011 so it could serve the needs of the community more than it has and the recreation center has exceeded its purpose over the last 10 years since the renovation. In 2018 as well, the municipality poured another \$50,000 into the WMMC to upgrade the showers, something that would just go to waste if the arena is decommissioned as suggested.

As a hockey player, I have spent my entire career in Southwestern Ontario, mainly calling the arenas of Strathroy-Caradoc my home. In 2018-2019 I had the privilege of becoming one of the only local players to ever suit up for the London Knights of the Ontario Hockey League, an opportunity I never would have received if I did not start playing hockey in the West Middlesex Memorial Centre on Saturday mornings all throughout the winter through my early days. Since its inception in 1993, this guild has been active in the community, giving hands-on demonstrations of spinning, weaving, felting and dyeing at schools, fairs, home shows, Art in the Park and the Strathroy Saturday markets. Outreach programs are an important part of the guild. Open house events, children's teaching sessions and adult workshops brought non-residents to the town. We raise funds and produce items for the Women's Rural Resource Centre. This 46-member guild is distinguished by its Study Groups as well as the extensive library and equipment resource, the key reasons for membership drawn from Strathroy, London, Middlesex and surrounding counties.

Until December 2020 we had a rental agreement with SASCC to use the facility one day each week with additional storage space for our library and equipment. Suddenly on extremely short notice we were forced to vacate and immediately find storage space. We were assured at the time that the town would do what it could to assist with accommodating our needs in another municipally owned facility. Post Covid-19, we plan to resume meeting in September and there is no doubt that if we must pay commercial rates for space, it will eventually lead to closure of this not-for-profit organization.

Before moving to SASC in 2013, the guild had for many years operated on the lower floor of the town hall alongside The Art Group. In light of the town's traditionally supportive place in the life of the Arts in Strathroy, our guild will appreciate members of council giving careful consideration to this letter and to the role the town can play in ensuring that Strathroy's Fibre Arts guild can continue its work. What steps does The Town of Strathroy-Caradoc intend to take to assist those organizations and the many seniors activities that were displaced when the centre was closed?
